## Scripture Reading — Revelation 21:1-4, 22:1-5

Then I saw a new heaven and a new earth, for the first heaven and the first earth had passed away, and the sea was no more. <sup>2</sup> And I saw the holy city, new Jerusalem, coming down out of heaven from God, prepared as a bride adorned for her husband. <sup>3</sup> And I heard a loud voice from the throne saying, "Behold, the dwelling place of God is with man. He will dwell with them, and they will be his people, and God himself will be with them as their God. <sup>4</sup> He will wipe away every tear from their eyes, and death shall be no more, neither shall there be mourning, nor crying, nor pain anymore, for the former things have passed away."

# **DAILY DEVOTION**

Philippians 2:5-8 — <sup>5</sup>Have this mind among yourselves, which is yours in Christ Jesus, <sup>6</sup>who, though he was in the form of God, did not count equality with God a thing to be grasped, <sup>7</sup>but emptied himself, by taking the form of a servant, being born in the likeness of men. <sup>8</sup>And being found in human form, he humbled himself by becoming obedient to the point of death, even death on a cross.

**Westminster Confession 32.1.** The bodies of men, after death, return to dust, and see corruption: but their souls, which neither die nor sleep, having an immortal subsistence, immediately return to God who gave them: the souls of the righteous, being then made perfect in holiness, are received into the highest heavens, where they behold the face of God, in light and glory, waiting for the full redemption of their bodies. And the souls of the wicked are cast into hell, where they remain in torments and utter darkness, reserved to the judgment of the great day. Beside these two places, for souls separated from their bodies, the Scripture acknowledges none.

**Monday:** Phil 1:21. Consider how others you know would answer "to live is...." What does the evidence of your own life answer? Paul says the reason for his existence is Christ. How does Gal 2:20 help understand that? How have you seen Paul live this in 1:13, 14, 20, 3:8-9? How can you grow more consistently in this resolution?

**Tuesday**: Phil 1:21. How does American culture view death? How do you view your death? What if it was tomorrow? How can Paul view death as gain (e.g. v 23, 1 Cor 15:53-55, Lk 23:43, Rev 21:1-3, 1 Jn 3:2)? How does this challenge, comfort, and embolden you?

**Wednesday:** Phil 1:21-23. The resurrection can be seen as a nice consolation after losing life. We might say "death is a reality, but life is better by far!" Paul is the opposite: "to die is gain, I am hard pressed between the two, to depart is better by far." How does v 23's "to be with Christ" explain that (3:8, 10, 14, 20-21, 4:19, Col 3:1-4, Eph 3:16-19)? Using these texts, ask the Spirit to draw your affections to Christ.

**Thursday:** Phil 1:21-24. Since our death is to be left in God's hands, Paul too expects to remain longer. What does that mean for Paul (v 22)? How does this explain part of v 20's "honor Christ in my body"? Do you view your time here as a time for fruitful labor? How can you be fruitful in the place God has put you, whether it is a major or minor role (e.g. 1:27f, 2:12f, 14, 4:8-9, Col 3:12-17)?

**Friday:** According to Phil 1:24-25, what three things does Paul aim to produce in the church? How has the church's ministry increased each of these in your own life? What has been most effective in producing progress, joy, and Christ-exaltation for you -revitalize those things. How can you work to advance these things in others?

**Saturday:** Phil 1:27-30. How is our manner of life to be a response to the gospel of Christ?
