

“Possess yourself with this maxim, that godliness is the end of your creation; God never sent men into the world, only to eat and drink and put on fine clothes, but that they ‘might serve him in righteousness and holiness.’ Luke 1:75. DAILY DEVOTION

Memory Verse: Philippians 2:9 — ⁹Therefore God has highly exalted him and bestowed on him the name that is above every name, ¹⁰so that at the name of Jesus every knee should bow, in heaven and on earth and under the earth, ¹¹and every tongue confess that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Father.

Westminster Shorter Catechism 75: What is sanctification? *Sanctification is a work of God's grace, whereby they whom God has, before the foundation of the world, chosen to be holy, are in time, through the powerful operation of his Spirit applying the death and resurrection of Christ unto them, renewed in their whole man after the image of God; having the seeds of repentance unto life, and all other saving graces, put into their hearts, and those graces so stirred up, increased, and strengthened, as that they more and more die unto sin, and rise unto newness of life.*

Monday: Phil 1:27's "let your manner of life", or "conduct yourselves" plays on the idea of citizenship. "Discharge your obligations as citizens of the heavenly kingdom." Read the following texts on our heavenly citizenship: Eph 2:19, Heb 10:34-35, 11:13-16, Phil 3:20f, 2 Pet 3:12-14. Think about your citizenship today. Pray that it shapes your thoughts, priorities, and actions.

Tuesday: As citizens of the heavenly kingdom, what does God call you to do in Phil 1:27? Read the following texts to get fill out what "live worthy" means: 1 Thess 2:10-12, Col 1:10-11, Eph 4:1-3. Where is the Spirit prompting you to growth in "worthy" living? How does Paul root your obedience in what Christ has already done for you (v 27)? Why is this important?

Wednesday: Phil 1:27-30. What are some of the challenges to holy living mentioned in this passage? V 29 says these sufferings have been granted, or graciously given, for Jesus' sake. How can God use suffering as a gift to clarify (Mt 6:21), pry (1 Pet 4:2), stretch (Heb 5:8), and press (Phil 3:8)? Have you experienced this? Have you seen it in others? Pray for this work to be accomplished in you (and others) through your suffering.

Thursday: Phil 1:27-28. Argue from the text that living worthy of the gospel is not an individual, isolated task. How does the church-community help? How can you do this? What is the "one spirit" and "one mind" that we are all to share (Phil 2:2-5)? Do you sense any obligation to your fellow saints? How can this text add clarity to your task even when you differ with others?

Friday: Phil 1:28 speaks of the ultimate conflict in which we battle. What confidence does the believer have in this struggle against the Prince of darkness (Rom 8:31)? What is the sober end of those who oppose God? If v 30's "conflict" is the struggle to advance the gospel, how does that tie in with v 28? Pray and seek opportunity to be a light!

Saturday: How does Phil 2:1-4 tie in to 1:27?
