Sermon Text — Luke 1:57-80

⁵⁷ Now the time came for Elizabeth to give birth, and she bore a son. ⁵⁸ And her neighbors and relatives heard that the Lord had shown great mercy to her, and they rejoiced with her. ⁵⁹ And on the eighth day they came to circumcise the child. And they would have called him Zechariah after his father, ⁶⁰ but his mother answered, "No; he shall be called John." ⁶¹ And they said to her, "None of your relatives is called by this name." ⁶² And they made signs to his father, inquiring what he wanted him to be called. ⁶³ And he asked for a writing tablet and wrote, "His name is John." And they all wondered. ⁶⁴ And immediately his mouth was opened and his tongue loosed, and he spoke, blessing God. ⁶⁵ And fear came on all their neighbors. And all these things were talked about through all the hill country of Judea, ⁶⁶ and all who heard them laid them up in their hearts, saying, "What then will this child be?" For the hand of the Lord was with him.

DAILY DEVOTION

Memory Text — Isaiah 9:6 ⁶ For to us a child is born, to us a son is given; and the government shall be upon his shoulder, and his name shall be called Wonderful Counselor, Mighty God, Everlasting Father, Prince of Peace.

Monday: Lk 1:68-71. What does the horn in v 69 communicate (Deut 33:17)? Consider what "horn of salvation" means based on 2 Sam 22:1-3. How is Jesus powerful? How did he display that power in his life (Mt 4:4ff, Mk 5:9, 15, Jn 11:43, Mt 26:27)? Do you think of Jesus as powerful, the ox's horns, at Christmas? How would this perspective affect your prayers?

Tuesday: Lk 1:69-71, 74. What were some of Israel's enemies in the OT? What was at least part of their exception of a Messiah (Acts 1:6, John 17:33-36)? How do vv 75-79 show that Zechariah is thinking of spiritual deliverance/enemies? How has Jesus powerfully defeated Satan (Heb 2:14, Gen 3:15, Rom 8:1, 1 Cor 15:54-57)? Live out of this truth today.

Wednesday: Lk 1:69-71, 74. How has Jesus delivered you from the dominion of sin? Take a specific sin of yours and trace it condemning and enslaving power. How has Jesus freed you from that, and granted you fuller life? Consider Rom 6:11, 17, 22. What confidence and fighting-faith does this give you? By the Holy Spirit's power you can say no to sin, and resist temptation (1 Cor 10:13). Pray for this, and fight for it today.

Thursday: Read Luke 1:68-74 and Acts 4:24-30. How has Christ already saved and delivered us from our enemies (see also Col 1:13). How does that give confidence in the battle against sin? How has he not yet delivered us from our enemies? How does that give courage and comfort when sinned against or in trial? Why can we serve God fearlessly now (v 74)? Where do you need to remember that?

Friday: Read Luke 1:68-75. What is the purpose for which God kept his covenant? Write down the three biggest areas you need to grow in holiness and righteousness. Read Eph 4:20-24 and note the "put off" and "put on" contrast. Write down the three biggest areas you need to be holier/more righteous. What are you to put off, and what are you put on? How does Luke 1:68-79 motivate you to do this?

Saturday: Read Luke 2:8-20. Pray that your heart resonates with the angels' song and the shepherds' response.
