Confession of Sin — Galatians 5:1-6

For freedom Christ has set us free; stand firm therefore, and do not submit again to a yoke of slavery. ²Look: I, Paul, say to you that if you accept circumcision, Christ will be of no advantage to you. ³I testify again to every man who accepts circumcision that he is obligated to keep the whole law. ⁴You are severed from Christ, you who would be justified by the law; you have fallen away from grace. ⁵For through the Spirit, by faith, we ourselves eagerly wait for the hope of righteousness. ⁶For in Christ Jesus neither circumcision nor uncircumcision counts for anything, but only faith working through love.

Assurance of Pardon — Romans 8:1-6

There is therefore now no condemnation for those who are in Christ Jesus. ² For the law of the Spirit of life has set you free in Christ Jesus from the law of sin and death. ³ For God has done what the law, weakened by the flesh, could not do. By sending his own Son in the likeness of sinful flesh and for sin, he condemned sin in the flesh, ⁴ in order that the righteous requirement of the law might be fulfilled in us, who walk not according to the flesh but according to the Spirit. ⁵ For those who live according to the flesh set their minds on the things of the flesh, but those who live according to the Spirit set their minds on the things of the Spirit. ⁶ For to set the mind on the flesh is death, but to set the mind on the Spirit is life and peace.



Memory Text— **Philippians 2:14-15** ¹⁴ Do all things without grumbling or disputing, ¹⁵ that you may be blameless and innocent, children of God without blemish in the midst of a crooked and twisted generation, among whom you shine as lights in the world,

Westminster Confession 18.2 — This certainty [of salvation] is not a bare conjectural and probable persuasion grounded upon a fallible hope; but an infallible assurance of faith founded upon the divine truth of the promises of salvation, the inward evidence of those graces unto which these promises are made, the testimony of the Spirit of adoption witnessing with our spirits that we are the children of God, which Spirit is the earnest of our inheritance, whereby we are sealed to the day of redemption.

Monday: Phil 3:1. What is the difference between happiness and Christian joy? What is the source, and the foundation of our joy (e.g. Phil 3:9, Rom 8:32f, 39, 15-17)? To what do you typically attach your joy? How can you better obey this imperative to "rejoice in the Lord"?

Tuesday: Phil 3:1-2. How is the warning in v 2 a call to protect your joy? What did these false teachers teach (Acts 15:1, Gal 2:12, 14)? How does this cut off Jesus' complete penalty paying on the cross, and his perfect obedience (see Gal 5:2)? What happens to our confidence and our assurance if we make (or add) anything other than Jesus the ground for our salvation? Stand today on Christ alone and rejoice in him!

Wednesday: Phil 3:2. "The dogs" were those outside of God's people. "The evil-doers" were those who did the law but to earn God's favor. "The mutilators" were those who made circumcision and rites a "must" for salvation. What other religions have performance as a must to be right with God? What Christian groups/churches teach something more than faith alone to be right with God? What ads have you heard that promote a self-salvation? Where in your heart to you see the seeds of this performance or merit? Pray for all the above.

Thursday: Phil 3:3. According to the following verses, to what did circumcision point: Gen 17:10-14, Deut 30:6, Rom 4:11, Gal 3:29, Rom 2:27-29? How does Jesus' finished work, and faith in Jesus fulfill all those texts? Do you believe in Jesus? Do you believe he has fully paid for all your sins? Do you believe he has granted you his righteous life? How will you respond with praise, and with obedience?

Friday: Phil 3:3. To be "the real circumcision" is to worship by the Spirit, or, to be indwelt by the Spirit and a partaker of the "new creation" (2 Cor 5:17, Jn 6:63). To whom does the Spirit point you (Jn 14:26)? Of what does he convince you (Jn 16:8, Gal 4:6, Rom 12:1)? Pray that the Spirit convinces you more deeply of Jesus' beauty and work and provoke you to a greater obedience.

Saturday: Phil 3:3. How does "put no confidence in the flesh" explain "glory in Christ Jesus" by way of contrast? What confidence in your standing, accomplishments, or abilities to you need to let go of? How does confidence in Jesus alone promote joy?
