

DAILY DEVOTION

Memory Text — **Psalm 63:5** ⁵ Commit your way to the LORD; trust in him, and he will act.

Heidelberg Catechism 125: What is the Fourth Petition [in the Lord's Prayer]? "Give us this day our daily bread"; that is, be pleased to provide us with all things necessary for the body, that we may thereby acknowledge thee to be the only fountain of all good, and that neither our care nor industry, nor even thy gifts, can profit us without thy blessing; and therefore that we may withdraw our trust from all creatures, and place it alone in thee.

Monday: Ps 37:1-11. Is work part of the curse (Gen 2:15)? What does Ps 37:3, 5-6 cal us to do in terms of work? How are you using your time, talents, and treasures to serve the church (1 Cor 12:7, Eph 4:15f)? Are you over-invested, or under-invested? Pray that the whole church will strain together to "do good," and mature together.

Tuesday: What command is repeated in Ps 37:1, 7, 8? What is the reason given? How and where does "fretting" manifest itself in your life? How can we do our work (broadly speaking this includes whatever God has called you to do) from a place of fretfulness (v 8, Ps 127:2, Mt 6:28)? How does the principle of rest challenge that fretful heart/fretful work? How does Jesus' perfect work free your soul to rest?

Wednesday: Ps 37:3-4 call us to fight fretting by looking up. We fret because we calculate without God. How does v 3 call us to calculate with God? How can you get to know God better this year so that you trust him more often, and more deeply? What does v 4's "delight in the LORD" heighten this looking up? Consider meditating on Is 43:1-5, Jn 14:1-2, Zeph 3:12-20, Mt 27:32-53 to bolster your delight and trust in God.

Thursday: "Commit" in Ps 37:5 means "roll on to." To roll your fret-burden on to God you need to look at it, define it, and actively give it to God (1 Pet 5:4-5). Do this. With what you fret over, what part is your responsibility (faithfulness) and what is other's, or God's? Is the outcome your responsibility? How does looking at Jesus, and abiding in him help you know the way, and leave the end-results to God?

Friday: How does Ps 37:7-11 call us to fight fretting by looking ahead? How does the eternal perspective put your problems in their place, in the right priority? How does God's future vindication encourage you to press on in faithfulness? Ask God to grant that you work from a heart at rest.

Saturday: Read Phil 2:19-30. Why does Paul want to send Timothy? Why did he sent Epaphroditus? How can you work for someone else's joyful encouragement?
