- *Adult Sunday School descriptions, as we begin Sunday school next week, here are the offerings for the adult classes:
 - John Jastrzembski will lead a study through the book of Deuteronomy, based on Dr. Robert Godfrey's Deuteronomy video series. Many Christians are surprised to learn that Deuteronomy is one of the most frequently quoted books in the New Testament. Why did Jesus and the Apostles teach from it so often, and what can you gain from reading it today? Dr. W. Robert Godfrey connects the land, laws, and leaders of Deuteronomy to the Christian life. At first glance, this ancient book may seem irrelevant. But take a closer look, and you'll discover how it points to the Savior and helps prepare your heart for Him.

• Dave Myers will lead the class through "For the Body." The human body is an amazing gift, yet today, many people downplay its importance and fail to understand what Christianity teaches about our bodies and their God-given purposes. We misunderstand how the body was designed, its role in relating to others, and lack awareness of the dangers of objectifying the body, divorcing it from its intended purpose. In For the Body, author Timothy Tennent looks at what it means to be created in the image of God and how our bodies serve as icons that illuminate God's purposes. Tennent examines topics like marriage, family, singleness, and friendship, and he looks at how the human body has been objectified in art and media today. He also offers a framework for discipling people today in a Christian theology of the body.

DAILY DEVOTION

Memory Text— Psalm 2:11 ¹¹ Serve the LORD with fear, and rejoice with trembling.

Westminster Confession 3.1 "Of God's Eternal Decree." God from all eternity, did, by the most wise and holy counsel of His own will, freely, and unchangeably ordain whatsoever comes to pass; yet so, as thereby neither is God the author of sin, nor is violence offered to the will of the creatures; nor is the liberty or contingency of second causes taken away, but rather established.

Monday: Acts 4:23. Why were Peter and John imprisoned (Acts 4:1-22)? What had they said to Peter and John? What sorts of temptations would you face in that situation? What might you be thinking about God? What does the church do (v 24)? How should trials, troubles, and struggle turn us to God? Is that your habit? Do so now.

Tuesday: Acts 4:24. Compare the beginning of this prayer with Is 37:16-20 and Neh 9:6. How does the fact that God is sovereign help when we're persecuted or perplexed, weak or scared? What does the church's focus on God as Creator in v 24 help them in this situation? What is the practical application of God as Creator for you?

Wednesday: Acts 4:25-27. What are some of the many sources of fear, abuse of power and might around you? Is God thrown off, or undone by any of these power-houses raging? How does the fact that he prophesied it in Ps 2 make any difference? Read Ps 2:4-9. How does this hearted you, and strengthen you? How might it have freed the early church to keep speaking the gospel boldly?

Thursday: Acts 4:27-28. What were the results of Herod et al's ragings (Acts 2:13-15)? According to v 28 did this surprise God? How does God's decree, and his predestining all things actually serve to comfort and fortify you in troubled times (Acts 2:22-24/Eph 1:11; Gen 50:20, Rom 8:28, 35-39)? Actively trust this/Him.

Friday: Acts 4:29-30-31. For what three things does the church actually ask? How does God answer them? Why should we ask God for more of the Spirit (Lk 11:13, Gal 5:22-23)? The result of the prayer was Spirit-empowered boldness to keep speaking God's Word. Pray for that same thing for yourself and New Hope. Look for and take the opportunities as they come.

Saturday: Read Isaiah 1:1-10. Why was God displeased with Israel?
