Sermon Text — Isaiah 3-4

¹For behold, the Lord GOD of hosts
is taking away from Jerusalem and from Judah
support and supply, all support of bread, and all support of water;
²the mighty man and the soldier, the judge and the prophet,
the diviner and the elder,
³the captain of fifty and the man of rank,
the counselor and the skillful magician and the expert in charms.
⁴And I will make boys their princes, and infants shall rule over them.
⁵And the people will oppress one another,
every one his fellow and every one his neighbor;
the youth will be insolent to the elder,
and the despised to the honorable.
⁶For a man will take hold of his brother
in the house of his father, saying:
“You have a cloak; you shall be our leader,
and this heap of ruins shall be under your rule”;
⁷in that day he will speak out, saying:
“I will not be a healer; in my house there is neither bread nor cloak;
you shall not make me leader of the people.”
⁸For Jerusalem has stumbled, and Judah has fallen,

they proclaim their sin like Sodom;
they do not hide it.

¹⁶ The LORD said: Because the daughters of Zion are haughty
and walk with outstretched necks,
glancing wantonly with their eyes,

mincing along as they go, tinkling with their feet,

¹⁷ therefore the Lord will strike with a scab
the heads of the daughters of Zion,
and the LORD will lay bare their secret parts.

¹⁸ In that day the Lord will take away the finery of the anklets, the headbands,
and the crescents; ¹⁹ the pendants, the bracelets, and the scarves; ²⁰ the head-
dresses, the armlets, the sashes, the perfume boxes, and the amulets; ²¹ the
signet rings and nose rings; ²² the festal robes, the mantles, the cloaks, and the
handbags; ²³ the mirrors, the linen garments, the turbans, and the veils.

²⁴ Instead of perfume there will be rotteness;
and instead of a belt, a rope;

and instead of well-set hair, baldness;
and instead of a rich robe, a skirt of sackcloth;
and branding instead of beauty.

²⁵ Your men shall fall by the sword
and your mighty men in battle.

²⁶ And her gates shall lament and mourn;
empty, she shall sit on the ground.

4 And seven women shall take hold of one man in that day, saying, “We will eat
our own bread and wear our own clothes, only let us be called by your name;
take away our reproach.”

² In that day the branch of the LORD shall be beautiful and glorious, and the fruit
of the land shall be the pride and honor of the survivors of Israel. ³ And he who
is left in Zion and remains in Jerusalem will be called holy, everyone who has
been recorded for life in Jerusalem, ⁴ when the Lord shall have washed away
the filth of the daughters of Zion and cleansed the bloodstains of Jerusalem
from its midst by a spirit of judgment and by a spirit of burning. ⁵ Then the LORD
will create over the whole site of Mount Zion and over her assemblies a cloud
by day, and smoke and the shining of a flaming fire by night; for over all the
glory there will be a canopy. ⁶ There will be a booth for shade by day from the
heat, and for a refuge and a shelter from the storm and rain.

DAILY DEVOTION

Memory Text Isaiah 6:1-3 — In the year that King Uzziah died I saw the Lord sitting upon a throne, high and lifted up; and the train of his robe filled the temple. ² Above him stood the seraphim. Each had six wings: with two he covered his face, and with two he covered his feet, and with two he flew. ³ And one called to another and said: “Holy, holy, holy is the LORD of hosts; the whole earth is full of his glory!”

Westminster Larger Catechism 104, What are the duties required in the first commandment? *The duties required in the first commandment are, the knowing and acknowledging of God to be the only true God, and our God; and to worship and glorify him accordingly, by thinking, meditating, remembering, highly esteeming, honoring, adoring, choosing, loving, desiring, fearing of him; believing him; trusting, hoping, delighting, rejoicing in him; being zealous for him; calling upon him, giving all praise and thanks, and yielding all obedience and submission to him with the whole man; being careful in all things to please him, and sorrowful when in anything he is offended; and walking humbly with him.*

Monday: Isaiah 3:1-7. How does we/you pursue and long for stability and security in your life, church, and country? How do you respond when it is threatened? What does God actively do in v 1 and 18 to stability and security? What does the Lord remove first (v 2-3)? What is the result of this (vv 4-7)? Why does God sometimes take away stability (Heb 11:13-16, 24-26)?

Tuesday: Isaiah 3:8-15. Why does God take away Judah’s support (vv 8-9, 12, 14-15)? How do vv 13-14 explain what the LORD is doing? Compare Is 3:1 and 4:1 with Lev 26:26-29. God is bringing his people to justice, but is that all he is doing (Heb 12:6)? How is the reality of God as Holy Judge a motivation to repentance and holy living (2 Pet 3:11-14, Rev 3:19)?

Wednesday: Isaiah 3:16-4:1. Why does God judge Zion’s daughter (v 16)? What does God take away (v 18)? What will these women put on instead due to God’s judgment (vv 24-26)? To what degree is their loss (vv 25-4:1)? How do you see love of stability and security in 3:16-4:1? Why is it hard, but why must he hold those things loosely (Lk 18:22-25)? What stability does Jesus offer (Lk 18:28-30)?

Thursday: Isaiah 4:2-6. How does grace once again interrupt justice? The children of God are fruitless and condemned (3:14) -how does that contrast with this Branch? How is this Branch both divine (of the LORD, (Jer 23:5, Jn 15:1) and human (fruit ‘of the earth,’ Is 11:1, Mt 1:1)? The beauty, glory, pride, and honor are “for” the survivors. How and what benefits do believers receive from Christ (e.g. Eph 1:3-8)?

Friday: Isaiah 4:3-6. Ponder over what Jesus will do for/to the remnant. How has Christ done this, and how is he doing this for you? Pray through these verses, including adoration, thanks, and supplication.

Saturday: Isaiah 5:1-7. What has Jesus done for this vineyard?
