Sermon Text — Ruth 4

Now Boaz had gone up to the gate and sat down there. And behold, the redeemer, of whom Boaz had spoken, came by. So Boaz said, "Turn aside, friend; sit down here." And he turned aside and sat down. ² And he took ten men of the elders of the city and said, "Sit down here." So they sat down. 3 Then he said to the redeemer, "Naomi, who has come back from the country of Moab, is selling the parcel of land that belonged to our relative Elimelech. 4So I thought I would tell you of it and say, 'Buy it in the presence of those sitting here and in the presence of the elders of my people.' If you will redeem it, redeem it. But if you will not, tell me, that I may know, for there is no one besides you to redeem it, and I come after you." And he said, "I will redeem it." ⁵Then Boaz said, "The day you buy the field from the hand of Naomi, you also acquire Ruth the Moabite, the widow of the dead, in order to perpetuate the name of the dead in his inheritance." ⁶Then the redeemer said. "I cannot redeem it for myself, lest I impair my own inheritance. Take my right of redemption yourself, for I cannot redeem it."

⁷ Now this was the custom in former times in Israel concerning redeeming and exchanging: to confirm a transaction, the one drew off his sandal and gave it to the other, and this was the manner of attesting in Israel. ⁸ So when the redeemer said to Boaz, "Buy it for yourself," he drew off his sandal. ⁹ Then Boaz said to the elders and all the people, "You are witnesses this day that I have bought from the hand of Naomi all that belonged to Elimelech and all that belonged to Chilion and to Mahlon. ¹⁰ Also Ruth the Moabite, the widow of Mahlon, I have bought to be my wife, to perpetuate the name of the dead in his inheritance, that the name of the dead may not be cut off from among his brothers and from the gate of his native place. You are witnesses this day."

¹¹Then all the people who were at the gate and the elders said, "We are witnesses. May the LORD make the woman, who is coming into your house, like Rachel and Leah, who together built up the house of Israel.

May you act worthily in Ephrathah and be renowned in Bethlehem, ¹² and may your house be like the house of Perez, whom Tamar bore to Judah, because of the offspring that the LORD will give you by this young woman."

¹³ So Boaz took Ruth, and she became his wife. And he went in to her, and the LORD gave her conception, and she bore a son. ¹⁴ Then the women said to Naomi, "Blessed be the LORD, who has not left you this day without a redeemer, and may his name be renowned in Israel! ¹⁵ He shall be to you a restorer of life and a nourisher of your old age, for your daughter-in-law who loves you, who is more to you than seven sons, has given birth to him." ¹⁶ Then Naomi took the child and laid him on her lap and became his nurse. ¹⁷ And the women of the neighborhood gave him a name, saying, "A son has been born to Naomi." They named him Obed. He was the father of Jesse, the father of David. ¹⁸ Now these are the generations of Perez: Perez fathered Hezron, ¹⁹ Hezron fathered Ram, Ram fathered Amminadab, ²⁰ Amminadab fathered Nahshon, Nahshon fathered Salmon, ²¹ Salmon fathered Boaz, Boaz fathered Obed, ²² Obed fathered Jesse, and Jesse fathered David.

1. The inheritance of the dead (vv.1-8)


2. The name of the dead (vv.9-12)

Outreach & Ideas for the Resting Month of August

From Pastor Francis: Active rest takes planning. What follows are some ideas to prompt your thinking so that your resting month actually rebuilds you relationally, and refreshes you physically. **Do NOT do all these things**—that would be exhausting! Let me know what ideas and things you have done/plan to do!

Rebuilding Relationally

With God

- find a way to utilize the Sunday school hour to grow closer to God
- plan to go through the daily devotions this month
- plan to memorize and meditate on 4 verses (one per week)
- prepare for worship each Saturday night with prayer and rest
- if you have children, spend time each week in the Word with them (you can go over the sermon using the daily devotions, explain a Psalm to them, or read through Westminster shorter catechism guestions.
- commit to looking over your life for imbalances and disciplines you are weak in. write up a step by step plan to grow more faithful in it
- sing or listen to music Sunday morning
- read a book that will help you grow

With Church Members

- commit to staying in on Wednesday nights and have a family dinner, or have a few friends over for dinner
- plan to pray through the new church picture directory
- choose a book to discuss/work through with your spouse or a friend
- plan to meet someone in church you're not close to, or haven't talked to deeply for some time (maybe a walk in a park, or a simple dinner)
- plan to write/text someone to encourage/strengthen every week in April
- determine to be more truthful (in love) with those you were closest to
- ask someone to disciple you, or ask to disciple someone (you can go through a Bible book together, I'm happy to give you devotion questions of books I've preached through to guide you)

With Neighbors

- give that person who needs a nudge a nudge
- pray for your unbelieving neighbors
- make some kind of contact with your neighbors (invite over for a game?)
- find a creative way to serve or support a kingdom ministry
- go serve breakfast at the Rescue Mission

Refreshing Physically

- plan to surprise someone
- plan a fun outing
- plan to pay less attention to the news this month
- plan a fast from food in order to be prompted to prayer more
- plan a month of no social media, or TV
- think of someone who refreshes you and get together with them
- get outside for a walk, take pictures, bird watch, draw, or just enjoy the sunshine

DAILY DEVOTION

Memory Verse: Isaiah 9:7 Of the increase of his government and of peace there will be no end, on the throne of David and over his kingdom, to establish it and to uphold it with justice and with righteousness from this time forth and forevermore.

The zeal of the LORD of hosts will do this.

Westminster Confession of Faith 5.5: "The most wise, righteous, and gracious God, doth oftentimes leave for a season His own children to manifold temptations and the corruption of their own hearts, to chastise them for their former sins, or to discover unto them the hidden strength of corruption and deceitfulness of their hearts, that they may be humbled; and to raise them to a more close and constant dependence for their support upon himself, and to make them more watchful against all future occasions of sin, and for sundry other just and holy ends."

Monday: Boaz seeks to marry and redeem Ruth. He could have easily married her, without going through the correct process. Instead, he risks losing her in order to be above reproach. Boaz did the right thing, when doing the wrong thing would have been easier. Have you ever faced a similar situation? How did you respond? How are you responding to life's difficulties right now?

Tuesday: In Ruth 4:3-8 we see a contrast between the redeemer and Boaz. The redeemer is concerned for his own wealth and future. Boaz in selfless and cares for the needs of others. Prayerfully reflect on your own approach to your needs and others. Read Matthew 6:26-34. How does it encourage and/or convict you?

Wednesday: Ruth's status changes remarkably in Ruth 4:11. This is clearly the result of Ruth's righteous behavior and the favor of God. Yet, fame and status are not things which Ruth primarily sought. What is your approach to status, fame, and popularity? How do you fare, spiritually, when life is "going your way"? Do you think that your success brings glory to God? If so, how?

Thursday: Naomi receives a restorer of life (Ruth 4:15). Compared with Naomi's history (Ruth 1:1-5), this is a tremendous turnaround of events. How does this encourage you? Does this teach you anything about the character of God?

Friday: God provides a child for Elimelech, Boaz, Naomi, Ruth, and Israel during the time of the judges (Ruth 1:1; 4:13). The coming of this child marked a turnaround of events for all these characters. God, in His providence, brought restoration and hope amidst dark and catastrophic times. Which problems feel insurmountable to you right now? Do you believe that God is working all of life's circumstances for your good and His glory? How do you need to trust in God's providential care?

Saturday: The book of Ruth anticipates a promised child who will bring comfort and redemption to the characters in the story. This same child will ultimately bring comfort and redemption to all Israel through David. David brings comfort and redemption to God's people through his seed: Jesus. The stories of all these characters, and our own stories, find their ultimate place in Christ who is reconciling all things to Himself, preserving for Himself His own special people, and reigning until all His enemies are placed under His feet. Read 1 Peter 1. How does your story, with your hurts, sins, temptations, victories, relationships, etc. fit into Christ's story?
