# DAILY DEVOTION

Memory Verse: Isaiah 11: 6 • The wolf shall dwell with the lamb, and the leopard shall lie down with the young goat, and the calf and the lion and the fattened calf together; and a little child shall lead them.

**Westminster Confession 13.8 On Assurance....**And therefore it is the duty of every one to give all diligence to make his calling and election sure, [in the right use of ordinary means] that thereby his heart may be enlarged in peace and joy in the Holy Spirit, in love and thankfulness to God, and in strength and cheerfulness in the duties of obedience, the proper fruits of this assurance.

**Monday:** Isaiah 26:3. What is spiritual peace? Who is the source of perfect peace? How does God's ordaining peace for you contribute to your peace (26:12, Eph 1:4)? How does his covenant promise do that same (Gen 17:7)? What characteristics of God underscore the undisturbable nature of this peace God promises (e.g. unchanging)? Gaze on God today to gain more of this peace.

**Tuesday**: Isaiah 26:3. What do vv 1-2 describe? What are the walls and bulwarks? How does that set us up for perfect peace (Lk 2:14, Rom 5:1)? Why is reconciliation with God the origin of peace? What all changes when we are right with God in Jesus (e.g Rom 8:1, 15)? Take confidence in God's personal love for you (Rom 8:31-39)! Actively trust that God is for you, that you are completely forgiven!

**Wednesday:** Is 26:3. What disrupted Israel's peace in Isaiah's day (e.g. 7:1ff)? What was to happen to Moab's city (25:10)? What are things that offer you rest, peace, solace? How long to they last? How is Jesus the Prince of Peace (Rom 5:1, Jn 14:27)? What has he conquered? Does he rule over all, including your circumstances? How does that open the barn door wide for your personal peace? Bend your fears, concerns under his good rule.

**Thursday:** Is 26:3. What does it mean to "stay your mind" on God? Given the questions above, what about God are you to stay your mind on? Do you do this? If you are to stay your mind on God, you must capture and bend your thoughts. Which circumstances and thoughts must you put back in their "God-perspective"? Read Phil 4:4-7 for a New Testament counterpart to this text.

**Friday:** Is 26:3. We need to actively exercise our faith and trust in God in order to know his peace. Reflect on the lyrics of "Like a River Glorious" or "Whatever my God Ordains is Right." Plug in your fears, concerns, and circumstances into the song. Actively turn to God. Pray for the Spirit to work a true repose in the sunshine of God's favor.

**Saturday:** How does Isaiah 28:16 fit in the context of the whole chapter?
