DAILY DEVOTION

Memory Verse: Isaiah 26:3 — ³ You keep him in perfect peace whose mind is stayed on you, because he trusts in you.

Westminster Confession — Although hypocrites and other unregenerate men may vainly deceive themselves with false hopes and carnal presumptions of being in the favor of God, and estate of salvation (which hope of theirs shall perish): yet such as truly believe in the Lord Jesus, and love Him in sincerity, endeavoring to walk in all good conscience before Him, may, in this life, be certainly assured that they are in the state of grace, and may rejoice in the hope of the glory of God, which hope shall never make them ashamed.

Monday: What is the relationship assumed in Mt 7:21's "Lord, Lord"? Why will some of those claiming it not enter heaven? Go back over Mt 5:3-10, the God-centered, reoriented, Kingdom-citizen's life/character. Why is it impossible for someone truly claiming "Lord, Lord" not to be 'doing God's will' (Titus 2:14, 1 Cor 12:3)? Examine your life. Pray for more of the fruit of the Spirit in your life.

Tuesday: Note the massive claims Jesus makes on being Christ/God in Mt 7:21-28. What do the surprised people in v 22 have to back their claim of being Kingdom Citizens? Why are they really "workers of lawlessness" (v 23, cf 1 Cor 13:1-3)? How is Jesus comment about "knowing" the central the issue (Mt 6:21, 33, 1 Cor 8:2, 3)? How can you grow your relationship and love for God?

Wednesday: Mt 7:21-29 forces us to examine the genuineness of our relationship with Christ, but can shake our assurance. How do the following passages balance our weak faith: 1 John 3:19-24, 2:1-6, 4:13-16. What is the Christian's desire? What place does confession and repentance play in true citizenship?

Thursday: Mt 7:24-25, 28-29. Why was the crowd's respond to Jesus sermon not enough? What response does Jesus demand (v 24)? Look at James 1:22-25, 2:14-20, Ezek 33:31f, John 14:15, 21. What have you heard from the Word/God recently that you need to put into practice this week?

Friday: Mt 7:24-27. Read these verses as the severe warning they are. How does hearing and doing Jesus' word build a Christian strong to stand in the judgment, as well as in trials (1 John 3:23)? How do modern day philosophies or ways of thinking hold up under the storms of life (i.e. cancer, nearing death)?

Saturday: Read 1 Tim 2:2. How do the promises the congregation makes at a baptism tie in to this verse's principle?
