## Sermon Text — Isaiah 34

Draw near, O nations, to hear, and give attention, O peoples! Let the earth hear, and all that fills it;

the world, and all that comes from it.

<sup>2</sup> For the LORD is enraged against all the nations, and furious against all their host;

he has devoted them to destruction, has given them over for slaughter.

<sup>3</sup>Their slain shall be cast out, and the stench of their corpses shall rise; the mountains shall flow with their blood.

- <sup>4</sup> All the host of heaven shall rot away, and the skies roll up like a scroll.
- All their host shall fall, as leaves fall from the vine, like leaves falling from the fig tree.

<sup>5</sup> For my sword has drunk its fill in the heavens; behold, it descends for judgment upon Edom, upon the people I have devoted to destruction. <sup>6</sup> The LORD has a sword; it is sated with blood; it is gorged with fat. with the blood of lambs and goats, with the fat of the kidneys of rams. For the LORD has a sacrifice in Bozrah, a great slaughter in the land of Edom. <sup>7</sup> Wild oxen shall fall with them, and young steers with the mighty bulls. Their land shall drink its fill of blood, and their soil shall be gorged with fat. <sup>8</sup> For the LORD has a day of vengeance, a year of recompense for the cause of Zion. <sup>9</sup> And the streams of Edom shall be turned into pitch, and her soil into sulfur; her land shall become burning pitch. <sup>10</sup>Night and day it shall not be guenched; its smoke shall go up forever. From generation to generation it shall lie waste; none shall pass through it forever and ever. <sup>11</sup> But the hawk and the porcupine shall possess it, the owl and the raven shall dwell in it. He shall stretch the line of confusion over it, and the plumb line of emptiness. <sup>12</sup> Its nobles—there is no one there to call it a kingdom, and all its princes shall be nothing. <sup>13</sup>Thorns shall grow over its strongholds, nettles and thistles in its fortresses. It shall be the haunt of jackals, an abode for ostriches. <sup>14</sup> And wild animals shall meet with hyenas; the wild goat shall cry to his fellow; indeed, there the night bird settles and finds for herself a resting place. <sup>15</sup> There the owl nests and lays and hatches and gathers her young in her shadow; indeed, there the hawks are gathered, each one with her mate. <sup>16</sup> Seek and read from the book of the LORD: Not one of these shall be missing: none shall be without her mate. For the mouth of the LORD has commanded, and his Spirit has gathered them. <sup>17</sup> He has cast the lot for them: his hand has portioned it out to them with the line; they shall possess it forever; from generation to generation they shall dwell in it.

# DAILY DEVOTION

**Memory Verse:** Isaiah 35:3 - 3 Strengthen the weak hands, and make firm the feeble knees.

**Westminster LC 89** What shall be done to the wicked at the day of judgment? At the day of judgment, the wicked shall be set on Christ's left hand, and, upon clear evidence, and full conviction of their own consciences, shall have the fearful but just sentence of condemnation pronounced against them; and thereupon shall be cast out from the favorable presence of God, and the glorious fellow-ship with Christ, his saints, and all his holy angels, into hell, to be punished with unspeakable torments, both of body and soul, with the devil and his angels forever.

**Monday:** Isaiah 34. In what situation is Judah (Is 8:7-8)? Imagine how that would make them feel about God's power and control. How does Is 34 demonstrate God's sovereignty over the nations? How is that a comfort and strengthener to you/God's church (v 8, Mt 16:18, Gen 50:20)? If you have time, look up Num 20:14-21, Obadiah 8-14) to see why Edom is used as the symbol for all nations.

**Tuesday**: Glance over Isaiah 34 and 35 to see how God is sovereign both in judgment and salvation. What is the just reward for rejecting heavenly salvation and embracing earthly salvation? Reflect on the horror of this by looking at God's anger (2), sword (5), sacrifice (6), and day of vengeance (8-10). Compare Mt 25:41-46, Rev 18:1-3. Read 2 Cor 5:18-20. Pray for specific unbelievers, missionaries, preachers. Seek to grow closer to people in your circles and ask them curious questions. Disciple your children.

**Wednesday:** Read Is 34:1-9. If you are a believer, consider how Jesus bore all this so you don't have to (Col 2:13-14, Is 53:4-6)! If you are not a believer, consider what God is offering you freely by putting your faith in Jesus (Rom 6:23, Is 53:4-6). Praise God for this great salvation, and his kindness, goodness and grace! How can you express the wonder of such a great salvation in how you live/love others?

**Thursday:** Is 34. How does Isaiah 34 picture God's judgment using Old Testament concepts (v 2 devotion to destruction in Josh 6:17; v 6 the sacrifice in Lev 1:3-9; v 9 Sodom's destruction in Gen 19:24, v 11 the barren land in Lev 26:20-22; v 17 the casting of lots in Num 36:53)? How certain does v 16 say this day of judgment will be (Mt 24:29-35)? How will you live in light of this (Eph 5:15-16, Jude 17-23)?

**Friday:** Isaiah 34 should sober each of us. Read Mark 4:14-20 and look for yourself in the 4 seeds. Where are you? The key to being good soil is in knowing Jesus. Look at Is 34:5. Sin demands blood payment for our sin is against an eternal, holy God. Is 34:5 shows us our just judgment. But there's another way. Look at Is 53:6-8, Eph 5:2. Look at how the consummation of his salvation is depicted in Is 35:1, 9-10.

**Saturday:** Read Isaiah 35. Pray that God would meet us in the opening of his Word.
