Sermon Text — Isaiah 37:8-38

⁸The Rabshakeh returned, and found the king of Assyria fighting against Libnah, for he had heard that the king had left Lachish. ⁹Now the king heard concerning Tirhakah king of Cush, "He has set out to fight against you." And when he heard it, he sent messengers to Hezekiah, saying, ¹⁰ "Thus shall you speak to Hezekiah king of Judah: 'Do not let your God in whom you trust decive you by promising that Jerusalem will not be given into the hand of the king of Assyria. ¹¹ Behold, you have heard what the kings of Assyria have done to all lands, devoting them to destruction. And shall you be delivered? ¹² Have the gods of the nations delivered them, the nations that my fathers destroyed, Gozan, Haran, Rezeph, and the people of Eden who were in Telassar? ¹³ Where is the king of Hamath, the king of Arpad, the king of the city of Sepharvaim, the king of Hena, or the king of Ivvah?"

¹⁴ Hezekiah received the letter from the hand of the messengers, and read it; and Hezekiah went up to the house of the LORD, and spread it before the LORD. ¹⁵ And Hezekiah prayed to the LORD: ¹⁶ "O LORD of hosts, God of Israel, enthroned above the cherubim, you are the God, you alone, of all the kingdoms of the earth; you have made heaven and earth. ¹⁷ Incline your ear, O LORD, and hear; open your eyes, O LORD, and see; and hear all the words of Sennacherib, which he has sent to mock the living God. ¹⁸ Truly, O LORD, the kings of Assyria have laid waste all the nations and their lands, ¹⁹ and have cast their gods into the fire. For they were no gods, but the work of men's hands, wood and stone. Therefore they were destroyed. ²⁰ So now, O LORD our God, save us from his hand, that all the kingdoms of the earth may know that you alone are the LORD."

²¹ Then Isaiah the son of Amoz sent to Hezekiah, saying, "Thus says the LORD, the God of Israel: Because you have prayed to me concerning Sennacherib king of Assyria, ²² this is the word that the LORD has spoken concerning him:

"'She despises you, she scorns you—the virgin daughter of Zion; she wags her head behind you—the daughter of Jerusalem.

²³ "Whom have you mocked and reviled?

Against whom have you raised your voice

and lifted your eyes to the heights?

Against the Holy One of Israel!

- ²⁴ By your servants you have mocked the Lord, and you have said, With my many chariots
- I have gone up the heights of the mountains,
 - to the far recesses of Lebanon,

to cut down its tallest cedars, its choicest cypresses,

to come to its remotest height, its most fruitful forest.

²⁵I dug wells and drank waters,

to dry up with the sole of my foot all the streams of Egypt.

²⁶ "Have you not heard that I determined it long ago?

I planned from days of old what now I bring to pass,

that you should make fortified cities

crash into heaps of ruins,

²⁷ while their inhabitants, shorn of strength, are dismayed and confounded,

and have become like plants of the field and like tender grass, like grass on the housetops, blighted before it is grown.

²⁸ "I know your sitting down and your going out and coming in, and your raging against me.

²⁹ Because you have raged against me and your complacency has come to my ears, will be added a second to be added as a se

I will put my hook in your nose and my bit in your mouth,

and I will turn you back on the way by which you came.'

³⁰ "And this shall be the sign for you: this year you shall eat what grows of itself, and in the second year what springs from that. Then in the third year sow and reap, and plant vineyards, and eat their fruit. ³¹ And the surviving remnant of the house of Judah shall again take root downward and bear fruit upward. ³² For out of Jerusalem shall go a remnant, and out of Mount Zion a band of survivors. The zeal of the LORD of hosts will do this.

³³ "Therefore thus says the LORD concerning the king of Assyria: He shall not come into this city or shoot an arrow there or come before it with a shield or cast up a siege mound against it. ³⁴ By the way that he came, by the same he shall return, and he shall not come into this city, declares the LORD. ³⁵ For I will defend this city to save it, for my own sake and for the sake of my servant David."

³⁶ And the angel of the LORD went out and struck down 185,000 in the camp of the Assyrians. And when people arose early in the morning, behold, these were all dead bodies. ³⁷ Then Sennacherib king of Assyria departed and returned home and lived at Nineveh. ³⁸ And as he was worshiping in the house of Nisroch his god, Adrammelech and Sharezer, his sons, struck him down with the sword. And after they escaped into the land of Ararat, Esarhaddon his son reigned in his place.

Memory Text — Isaiah 35:6 ⁶ then shall the lame man leap like a deer, and the tongue of the mute sing for joy.

For waters break forth in the wilderness,

and streams in the desert;

Westminster Shorter Catechism 101. What do we pray for in the first petition? In the first petition, which is, "Hallowed be thy name," we pray, That God would enable us and others to glorify him in all that by which he makes himself known; and that he would dispose all things to his own glory.

Monday: Isaiah 37:8-13. How does v 8-9 give hope to Hezekiah (v 7)? How does the Rabshakeh diminish God and exalt Assyria? What is he trying to do with this message? What effect do you think this letter would have on Hezekiah? Do you have things that discourage you, make you feel defeated, deflated, or despair? How do you deal with this things? What is one way you ought to deal with them (1 Pet 5:6-8)?

Tuesday: Isaiah 37:14-20. Contrast 37:6 with 37:10, 14-15. Do you see growth in Hezekiah's faith? Why does Hezekiah spend all of v 16 on praying about who God is? How do you think that would give him renewed strength and courage (1 Sam 30:6, Eph 6:10)? Try pray like Hezekiah does in v 16. Take each descriptor of God, reflect on it in prayer, and lay your concerns before this God.

Wednesday: Isaiah 37:16-20. What is the first concern Hezekiah brings before God (v 17)? How does he contrast God with other gods (v 17-19)? What reason does he give for why God should save Jerusalem (20)? How can you pray in a more God-centered way? Is there an arena that you need to put God's honor and glory in the center instead of a solution to your problems (consider Phil 3:7-9)?

Thursday: Isaiah 37:21-29. How does Isaiah depict Assyria's "sovereignty" (vv 23-25)? What powers and people are powerful in your mind? How does God poke holes in Assyria's alleged sovereignty and demonstrate his own true sovereignty in vv 26f (Is 8:7-8, Eph 1:11), and in vv 28-29 (Ps 139:1-4, Is 37:36-38)? Meditate on God's sovereign power as you consider the news of the day. Praise him for it!

Friday: Isaiah 37:30-38. How does God demonstrate his sovereignty to Hezekiah and Jerusalem in vv 30-38? Why do you think Isaiah ties vv 30-32 back to Is 9:6-7 with the phrase "the zeal of the LORD will do this"? How is that connection sure hope for a lasting remnant? What reason does God give for rescuing Jerusalem in v 35? Why is David mentioned (Ps 89:3, Is 55:3, Mt 1:1)? Consider your security under God's sovereignty (Phil 1:6)!

Saturday: Consider the power of God as you read Isaiah 38.
