



Children's Church Dismissal — Children ages 4-5 may be dismissed to children's church at parents' discretion

Sermon Text — Isaiah 38

In those days Hezekiah became sick and was at the point of death. And Isaiah the prophet the son of Amoz came to him, and said to him, "Thus says the LORD: Set your house in order, for you shall die, you shall not recover."² Then Hezekiah turned his face to the wall and prayed to the LORD,³ and said, "Please, O LORD, remember how I have walked before you in faithfulness and with a whole heart, and have done what is good in your sight." And Hezekiah

wept bitterly.

⁴ Then the word of the LORD came to Isaiah: ⁵ “Go and say to Hezekiah, Thus says the LORD, the God of David your father: I have heard your prayer; I have seen your tears. Behold, I will add fifteen years to your life. ⁶ I will deliver you and this city out of the hand of the king of Assyria, and will defend this city. ⁷ “This shall be the sign to you from the LORD, that the LORD will do this thing that he has promised: ⁸ Behold, I will make the shadow cast by the declining sun on the dial of Ahaz turn back ten steps.” So the sun turned back on the dial the ten steps by which it had declined.

⁹ A writing of Hezekiah king of Judah, after he had been sick and had recovered from his sickness:

¹⁰ I said, In the middle of my days I must depart;

I am consigned to the gates of Sheol for the rest of my years.

¹¹ I said, I shall not see the LORD, the LORD in the land of the living;

I shall look on man no more among the inhabitants of the world.

¹² My dwelling is plucked up and removed from me like a shepherd's tent;

like a weaver I have rolled up my life; he cuts me off from the loom;

from day to night you bring me to an end; ¹³ I calmed myself until morning;

like a lion he breaks all my bones;

from day to night you bring me to an end.

¹⁴ Like a swallow or a crane I chirp; I moan like a dove.

My eyes are weary with looking upward.

O Lord, I am oppressed; be my pledge of safety!

¹⁵ What shall I say? For he has spoken to me,

and he himself has done it. I walk slowly all my years

because of the bitterness of my soul.

¹⁶ O Lord, by these things men live,

DAILY DEVOTION

Memory Text — **Isaiah 35:7** the burning sand shall become a pool, and the thirsty ground springs of water; in the haunt of jackals, where they lie down, the grass shall become reeds and rushes.

Westminster Shorter Catechism 26: How doth Christ execute the office of a king? *Christ executes the office of a king, in subduing us to himself, in ruling and defending us, and in restraining and conquering all his and our enemies.*

Monday: Isaiah 38:1-3. What does Isaiah tell Hezekiah? How would you respond if told you were going to die very soon (see Eph 5:16, 8)? What do you need to change now to live well before God? How many times does this chapter mention bitterness or tears? Is it wrong for Christians to lament death (1 Cor 15:26, Jn 11:33, 38)? What comfort does Christ give (1 Cor 15:55-56, 1 Thess 4:13)?

Tuesday: Isaiah 38:1-5. Is Hezekiah just any old person (Mt 1:9, 16)? How was he to serve Israel, God's people (Deut 17:18, Deut law writing, 2 Ki 18:3-7)? Consider how God here tested Hezekiah's commitment to his role, and to God's people. According to Hezekiah's prayer, and his song (vv 17-20), did he pass? Did Jesus pass his test (Lk 4:12-13, Jn 19:30)? How does a righteous, delivering King make any difference to you in trials, and in temptations (1 Cor 10:13)?

Wednesday: Consider Isaiah 38:4-8 from this perspective: God raises his dying king to life so the king can deliver his people. Reflect on Lk 1:69-75 and Rom 1:2-6 to see how God does this with Jesus ultimately. How can you give thanks for such a deliverance? Sing a song of thanks, and reflect on these passages in thankful prayer.

Thursday: Isaiah 38:16-20. What difference does being saved from death and given life make to Hezekiah in these verses? How do you see man's chief end reflected here? In v 19 he responds with thanksgiving. In v 20 with worship. Is your life a response of thanks and worship to the Lord for salvation (Rom 12:1-3)? How can you grow in this (Heb 10:25, 13:2, 16, Ps 100, Phil 4:4, 11f)?

Friday: Isaiah 38:19. What response to being brought from death to life is found in the last part of v 19? Note this theme in Gen 18:19, Deut 6:7, Ps 78:3ff, Eph 6:4. Disciplining your children and grandchildren is an essential part of new life in Jesus. How can you strengthen this in your home? If you do not have children, what responsibility do you have with the church's children? What about those outside the household of faith?

Saturday: Read Isaiah 39. How does this passage make us cry out for King Jesus?
