Confession of Sin — Deuteronomy 5:1-3, 6-21

Memory Text — **Isaiah 35:10** ¹⁰ And the ransomed of the Lord shall return and come to Zion with singing; everlasting joy shall be upon their heads; they shall obtain gladness and joy, and sorrow and sighing shall flee away.

Westminster Confession 7.3 Man, by his fall, having made himself incapable of life by that covenant, the Lord was pleased to make a second, commonly called the covenant of grace; wherein He freely offers unto sinners life and salvation by Jesus Christ; requiring of them faith in Him, that they may be saved, and promising to give unto all those that are ordained unto eternal life His Holy Spirit, to make them willing, and able to believe.

Monday: Gen 3:15. What illicit friendship was forged in Gen 3:1-6? What will God do to that friendship (the first phrase of Gen 3:15)? Compare this to James 4:4. How are you displaying friendship with God? Enmity with the world/devil? Ponder the Truest Friend in Jn 15:13-15, who makes you *want* to love God/the good.

Tuesday: Gen 3:15. Do you think Gen 3:15's "offspring" is physical or spiritual (Jn 8:44, 1 Jn 3:10)? Think of places where this antithesis between the godly and ungodly line clash (e.g. Gen 4:4-8, 1 Ki 19:14, Mt 2:16-18, Rev 12:1-6). How does this set our expectations? How does "I will set" give hope and confidence despite this opposition?

Wednesday: Gen 3:15. Trace the promise of this One who will bruise or strike Satan's head through Scripture: Gen 4:1, 25-26; Gen 15:2-5; Gen 49:9-10; Ruth 4:17/Mt 1:5; 2 Sam 7:12-16; Is 7:14; Is 9:6, Gal 4:4; Lk 1:34-36. Praise God for his faithfulness! How does this history give you confidence in your battle against sin, your standing with God, and your certainty of the final outcome?

Thursday: Gen 3:15. How has Jesus already crushed Satan's head/power (curse of law, Gal 3:10-13; restored fellowship, Rom 8:35ff; death, Heb 2:14f; accusations, Zech 3:1-5)? How will Jesus ultimately crush Satan's power (Rev 20:2, 10)? How does all this, together with Rom 16:20, give you confidence of God's love, your future, and to live for God?

Friday: Gen 3:15. What cost does God say will be part of this victory? How was Christ's heal bruised (Is 53:10, Acts 3:13-16)? How does Satan bruise Christians by direct attack (Acts 4:27-29, 1 Pet 5:8-9)? What about by infiltration (2 Cor 11:3, 2 Pet 2:1-3)? Pray that God will not lead us (Christians worldwide, and you) into temptation, but deliver us from the evil one.

Saturday: Mt 1:1-2. Why does Matthew want you to connect Jesus and Abraham?
