Jesus Christ's story is told as a retelling of Israel's history and by extension the centuries long fulfillment of God's covenant to Abraham. The use of Jewish terminology and particularly "Kingdom of Heaven" directly convey that Jesus is the heir to David's throne whose kingdom which shall last forever (2 Samuel 7:16). Ultimately, Matthew's genealogy serves as the perfect transition between the narrow Jewish stream of salvation through one man, nation, people to the now overflowing river of salvation that will wash over the whole Gentile world through its culmination in Jesus Christ and His victorious work on the cross.

Assurance of Pardon — Romans 4:1-3, 13-16, 23-25

DAILY DEVOTION

Memory Text — Isaiah 40:1 Comfort, comfort my people, says your God.

Heidelberg Catechism 21: True faith is not only a certain knowledge, by which I hold for truth all that God has revealed to us in his word, but also an assured confidence, which the Holy Spirit works by the gospel in my heart; that not only to others, but to me also, remission of sin, everlasting right-eousness and salvation, are freely given by God, merely of grace, only for the sake of Christ's merits.

Monday: Gen 12:1-4. Mt 1:1-2 emphasizes an Abraham-Jesus connection: "The covenant-keeper has come!" How old, and where was Abraham when God called him (v 4, 11:27ff)? Who takes the initiative in saving Abraham (Gen 15:17)? Who takes the initiative in the New Testament (Lk 19:10, Rom 9:16)? How should that embolden your prayers and witnessing (Rom 10:1, 14-17), and comfort you (Phil 1:6)?

Tuesday: Gen 12:1-4, Mt 1:1-2. What offspring promises does God make to Abraham? How old are Abraham and Sarah? How does he respond (Gen 15:6)? Who does Gal 3:16 say these promises were made to? How does Jesus fulfill the offspring-promise given to Abraham (Rom 3:21-24, 4:1-5, 11, 16)? Consider how God's gift of love/relationship ministers joy, peace, and hope to you in times of regret, failure, lackluster living.

Wednesday: Gen 12:1-4. What nation-promises does Abraham receive? How much of that did he realize (Gen 25:12, 19)? How does the child-King in Mt 1:1 blow open the doors on that promise (Gal 3:29, Rev 7:9-10)? What blessings does Jesus give to this "nation" (Eph 1:3ff)? Thank his for this. Consider the blessing of church family in terms of inclusion, acceptance, friendship, service, love (how can you develop this?).

Thursday: Gen 12:1-4. What land-promise does Abraham receive? How much of this did he realize (Gen 23:19-20)? How does the baby in Bethlehem (Mt 1:1-2) deliver on this promise (Mt 5:5, Heb 11:13-16)? How does this minister to you when you feel like a stranger or exile on earth, when you experience loss, disappointment? How can this truth give you joy, happiness, and contentment in life's trials and losses (Rev 21:3)?

Friday: Gen 12:1-4. How was Abraham to be a blessing to the families of the earth? How was Israel to do that (Ex 19:5-6)? How is this "blessing to the nations" fulfilled in Christ (Gal 3:14)? Consider the ministry of the Spirit (Gal 3:2-6, 5:17, 18, 22-25). As those blessed in all ways in Christ, how can you be a blessing to the nations?

Saturday: Meditate on Matthew 1:21.
