

Sermon Text — Genesis 49:8-12, Matthew 2:1-12

⁸ "Judah, your brothers shall praise you; your hand shall be on the neck of your enemies; your father's sons shall bow down before you.

⁹ Judah is a lion's cub;

from the prey, my son, you have gone up.
He stooped down; he crouched as a lion and as a lioness; who dares rouse him?

10 The scepter shall not depart from Judah, nor the ruler's staff from between his feet, until tribute comes to him;

and to him shall be the obedience of the peoples.

¹¹ Binding his foal to the vine and his donkey's colt to the choice vine, he has washed his garments in wine

and his vesture in the blood of grapes.

¹² His eyes are darker than wine, and his teeth whiter than milk.

¹Now after Jesus was born in Bethlehem of Judea in the days of Herod the king, behold, wise men from the east came to Jerusalem, ² saying, "Where is he who has been born king of the Jews? For we saw his star when it rose and have come to worship him." ³When Herod the king heard this, he was troubled, and all Jerusalem with him; ⁴and assembling all the chief priests and scribes of the people, he inquired of them where the Christ was to be born. ⁵They told him, "In Bethlehem of Judea, for so it is written by the prophet:

6 "'And you, O Bethlehem, in the land of Judah, are by no means least among the rulers of Judah; for from you shall come a ruler who will shepherd my people Israel."

⁷ Then Herod summoned the wise men secretly and ascertained from them what time the star had appeared. ⁸ And he sent them to Bethlehem, saying, "Go and search diligently for the child, and when you have found him, bring me word, that I too may come and worship him." ⁹ After listening to the king, they went on their way. And behold, the star that they had seen when it rose went before them until it came to rest over the place where the child was. ¹⁰ When they saw the star, they rejoiced exceedingly with great joy. ¹¹ And going into the house, they saw the child with Mary his mother, and they fell down and worshiped him. Then, opening their treasures, they offered him gifts, gold and frankincense and myrrh. ¹² And being warned in a dream not to return to Herod, they departed to their own country by another way.

Sunday Day School Classes for 2023:

- Adult Sunday School, Jan 8-Feb 12, John Clifford will focus on missions. Our goal will be to worship the living God, who sent the seed of the woman, the descendent of Abraham, the offspring of David, who overcomes the seed of the serpent, who blesses the nations of the world, who subdues all peoples to Himself, and calls us to be a holy nation and a royal priesthood, proclaiming the praises of His name. This 6-week class will cover a biblical theology of missions, a brief history of inspiring missionary biographies, and a practical guide to pray, send, and pursue missions.
