# DAILY DEVOTION

Memory Text — Isaiah 40:3-4 <sup>3</sup> A voice cries: "In the wilderness prepare the way of the Lord; make straight in the desert a highway for our God. <sup>4</sup> Every valley shall be lifted up, and every mountain and hill be made low; the uneven ground shall become level, and the rough places a plain.

Westminster Larger Catechism 1: What is the chief and highest end of man? Man's chief and highest end is to glorify God, and fully to enjoy him forever.

**Monday:** Is 40:1-2. Why is v 1 a surprising word? What does this tell you about God (Eph 2:4)? In what areas would Judah need comfort given the threatened exile? What are you things and areas you long to have, or did experience comfort in? How does God spell out this comfort in v 2? Do these things bring you solace/comfort?

**Tuesday**: Read Is 40:3-5 and Luke 3:3-8. According to Luke, who is the voice crying in the wilderness? What are at least 2 ways John the Baptist says we are to prepare for the coming King? What more is repentance than only turning from sin (1 Thess 1:9)? Spend some time working on a prayer of repentance.

**Wednesday:** Is 40:5. What is the heart of comfort found in v 5? Look up the following verses to determine what the Glory of God is: Ex 24:17, 34:7, 2 Chron 5:14, Ezek 1:28. How is God's glory revealed in Jesus (Jn 1:14)? How does a love for God's glory bring comfort and satisfaction to his people?

**Thursday:** Is 40:10-11. Arm here symbolizes personal strength in action. How had God's arm worked in Ex 15:6, 12-13? How does Jesus wield his arm in the NT? What about today? What does Isaiah add to Jesus' might in v 11? Meditate on v 11 unto your own comfort, rest, and joy (Mt 11:29, Jn 10:1-18).

**Friday:** Read Is 40:6-8 and 1 Pet 1:24-25. How does Isaiah underline the certainty of God's promise? How does Peter make specific what God is promising? How does the picture of grass challenge our trust in self, plans, and point us to live by God's promises? Why do you think v 9 is a fitting response to this whole section? Have you tasted afresh God's good news for you? How can you herald that to others?

**Saturday:** Read Isaiah 40:12-31. How do vv 12-26 support vv 27-31?
