Snow Policy

In the event that we have ANY snow this winter, we have a snow policy in place so that good decisions can be made and communicated well to the congregation. Please read through the policy below and contact Gingy at admin@newhopeopc.org if you have any questions.

SNOW SUNDAYS AND CANCELLATIONS

Who will decide snow cancellations: The pastor, together with the music team leader, and the lead elder will make this decision. Communication of Snow Days: A Sunday cancellation or Snow Sunday (see below) will be put on the New Hope Web page by 8:00 am Sunday morning. It will also be sent out via email. Finally, the New Hope phone will record a message stating that services are cancelled as well. Other event cancellations will only be emailed out and put on the website.

Sunday Services:

1. **Cancelled Sunday Service:** If there is a snow or ice emergency, and police advise us to stay off the roads, all activities will be cancelled including the worship service.
2. **Limited Sunday Service:** If there is lousy weather (but not as dire as # 1) we will call for a "Snow Sunday" or limited Sunday service. There will be a bare bones church service, but no Sunday School, and likely no nursery or musicians. All those scheduled to serve that day will not be obliged to come (nursery, ushers, greeters, SS teachers, musicians, sound team, etc). Congregants are urged to use their own judgment.
3. **Wednesday Night Study** (and other such events): If school is cancelled, or if they dismiss early, then all events at the church will be cancelled.

DAILY DEVOTION

Memory Text — Isaiah 40:5 ⁵ And the glory of the Lord shall be revealed, and all flesh shall see it together, for the mouth of the Lord has spoken.”

Westminster Larger Catechism 7 *God is a Spirit, in and of himself infinite in being, glory, blessedness, and perfection; all-sufficient, eternal, unchangeable, incomprehensible, everywhere present, almighty, knowing all things, most wise, most holy, most just, most merciful and gracious, long-suffering, and abundant in goodness and truth.*

Monday: Isaiah 40:27. Put Judah’s questions in your own words (see Job 27:2, Ps 31:22, 77:7-10). How might exile or hardship (sickness, failure, disappointment) produce such questions? When have you asked them? How might the promise of 40:5 and v 1 play into the questions? Consider how Jesus himself asked a very similar question in Mt 27:46. How does that help when it seems like God has forgotten or forsaken you?

Tuesday: Isaiah 40:12-20. How do you see God’s supreme power (v 12), wisdom (vv 13-14), immensity (v 15-17)? Try putting these comparisons into modern day terms (e.g. what nations do you think are powerful, what wisdom do you envy). How does this description of the glory of God answer Judah’s/our questions from v 27?

Wednesday: Isaiah 40:21-26. What is the picture in v 22? What does it communicate? Who are the top most powerful people in the world and/or your life? How can they make you feel (v 27)? According to vv 23-24 what are they compared to God’s power and rule? How does vv 25-26 cap off the proof of God’s supreme rule? How do these truths answer v 27’s questions (see Ps 118:6, Ps 56:4, Dan 2:34-37)?

Thursday: Isaiah 40:28-31 is the response of the faithful to God. Do you think this weariness and strength is primarily physical or spiritual? What does it mean to wait for the LORD (v 31, cf Ps 27:14, 37:34, 130:5)? Consider Heb 13:13-16 as an example of how trusting in/waiting for the Lord gave strength to persevere.

Friday: Isaiah 40:28-31. What truths in v 28 give you strength when you feel like life’s not fair, like you’re forgotten, forsaken, or mistreated (by God especially)? How does meditating on God’s character (vv 12-28) and God’s promises (v 5, 29) give you spiritual strength to continue walking in his pathways in trying times (2 Cor 12:9-10, Eph 3:16, Col 1:11)?

Saturday: Read Isaiah 41:14-16. From and to what does God transform Jacob? What does this tell you about God’s transforming power?
