- **Thank Offering Info**, at the end of 2022, New Hope sent \$2,260 to the OPC for the Thank Offering. Thanks to all of those who gave to support the gospel work of our denomination!

The OPC sent us the following report: It is a joy to report that giving for the 2022 Thank Offering has exceeded the stated goal of \$1,200,000. Gifts to the Thank Offering have totaled \$1,566,579 so far. We praise the triune God, Father, Son, and Spirit, for such graciousness as expressed by the members and friends of the Orthodox Presbyterian Church. The strong Thank Offering has also resulted in a total of \$5,084,204 for Worldwide Outreach in 2022. The distribution among the program committees is as follows:

Foreign Missions: \$2,273,765 (+10.6%) Home Missions: \$1,641,554 (+14.0%) Christian Education \$608,885 (+17.1%)

The Committee on Coordination and New Horizons also received their combined budget request of \$560,000.

- Sunday School Curriculum Responsibilities
  - Update the 3-year long-range plan for curriculum as needed in conjunction with the Edification committee.
  - Order curriculum for upcoming trimester in a timely manner and in accordance with what is needed for each classroom.
  - Keep curriculum organized and up to date
- Sunday School Teacher Responsibilities
  - Recruit Sunday school teachers for preschool through 8<sup>th</sup> grade classrooms in conjunction with the edification committee and using the prescribed teacher criteria.
  - Confirm each Sunday school teacher is background checked before they begin teaching.
  - Organize teacher training meetings as needed. Make sure each teacher is aware of their responsibilities, the Child Protection Policy, and what the expectations for the trimester will be.

- Attend Edification meetings when required.

**Memory Text** — **Isaiah 40:6** <sup>6</sup> A voice says, "Cry!" And I said, "What shall I cry?" All flesh is grass, and all its beauty is like the flower of the field.

**Heidelberg Catechism** # 26. What do you believe when you say, "I believe in God the Father, Almighty, Maker of heaven and earth?" That the eternal Father of our Lord Jesus Christ (who of nothing made heaven and earth, with all that is in them; who likewise upholds and governs the same by his eternal counsel and providence) is for the sake of Christ his Son, my God and my Father; on whom I rely so entirely, that I have no doubt, but he will provide me with all things necessary for soul and body and further, that he will make whatever evils he sends upon me, in this valley of tears turn out to my advantage; for he is able to do it, being Almighty God, and willing, being a faithful Father.

**Monday:** Isaiah 41:1-4. Fear is the "problem" in this chapter (v 5, 10, 15). How does what will/won't happen in the future cause you fear (try be specific)? How does the world deal with the future? In these verses, how does God comfort his people/you in light of the fear of the future (esp v 4, 46:10, Rev 22:13)?

**Tuesday**: Isaiah 41:1-10. To what is v 1 an invitation (cf 40:31)? To whom is it made? In vv 5-7 how do the nations respond to the reality of God's control over all history? How does this contrast with v 8-10? Why do you not need to fear the future (vv 8-10)? Find God's election, justification, perseverance, and care (8-10)? How does this strengthen you against fear of the future?

**Wednesday:** Isaiah 41:11-13. The heart of vv 8-13 is this bit about enemies. What will happen to God's/God's peoples' enemies? "In the coming realization of God's kingdom, the kingdom of evil will be subdued." See Rom 8:1, Mt 6:13, and Rev 20:10, 14, 21:1-4. How does this give hope and strength in trials, injustices, and attacks?

**Thursday:** Isaiah 41:14-16. What do you think of when you think of a worm? Why does Isaiah call God's people worms? Contrast that with what God calls them in v 15. How is what comes between those two descriptions the key to the transformation? Is God able to use the weak? What about your weaknesses? How does God strengthen you to have victory over your 3 enemies (Eph 2:1, 2, 3)?

**Friday:** Isaiah 41:17-20. How do vv 17-20 portray God? Who do they describe God's life-giving and his sustenance? How does God do this for our physical needs (Mt 6:11)? How does he do this for our spiritual needs (Is 55:1-3, Jn 7:37)? How does he do this ultimately (Rev 22:1-5)?

**Saturday:** Read Isaiah 42 and look for how God gives comforts to the nations (v 4, 6).
