DAILY DEVOTION

Memory Text — Isaiah 40:9 — ⁹Go on up to a high mountain, O Zion, herald of good news; lift up your voice with strength, O Jerusalem, herald of good news; lift it up, fear not; say to the cities of Judah, "Behold your God!"

Westminster Confession 3.6 As God has appointed the elect unto glory, so has He, by the eternal and most free purpose of His will, foreordained all the means thereunto. Wherefore, they who are elected, being fallen in Adam, are redeemed by Christ, are effectually called unto faith in Christ by His Spirit working in due season, are justified, adopted, sanctified, and kept by His power, through faith, unto salvation. Neither are any other redeemed by Christ, effectually called, justified, adopted, sanctified, and saved, but the elect only.

Monday: Isaiah 45:1-13. How many references can you find to God as Creator? Why so many? What point do verses 9-10 make about God's freedom over his creation (Rom 9:21)? What points does Isaiah make about God's sovereignty in v 7, 8, 11, and 12. What response should the creature have to God's freedom over his creation, and to his sovereignty (e.g. Ps 144:3, Rom 11:33-36)?

Tuesday: Isaiah 45:1-3. In vv 9-10 Judah is shocked at God's pottery usage. Look at 44:28 and 45:1-3 to determine why. What are some of your questions that make you question God's plans, purposes, and ways? Judah's response is to bring a court case ("strives", v 9) against God. What's wrong with that (Job 40:2, 4, 8, Rom 9:20)? Pray for a deepening humility before God and man.

Wednesday: Isaiah 45:1-3. Questions about why the sovereign God chooses some and passed by others, why pain and suffering are in his plan, etc, are real. How does God answer those questions in vv 9-10? How does he answer Job's questions in Job 40:4-5 and 41:1-6? How does he answer Paul's questions in Rom 9:18, 19-21, 11:33? Have you come up hard against the sovereignty of God -and rested there?

Thursday: Isaiah 45:4-8. God gives reason to trust him even when we don't understand all his ways. What purpose does he reveal in v 3 (Ezra 1:1 -4)? What purpose does he reveal in v 4? God secretly works for the good of his church (see Gen 50:20!). What broad, future, and beautiful purpose is found in v 6? How do all of these give you good reason to trust God despite what remains a mystery to you?

Friday: Isaiah 45:13. Judah struggled with Cyrus as God's anointed, shepherd, a Gentile "liberator." How does God kindly show his plan is perfect in v 13? Did God prove himself in history (2 Chron 36:23)? Trust him! Cyrus would fix Judah's 'national' problem. Scan Isaiah 52:13-53:12 for another shocking vessel, unlovely, despised, crushed by the Potter, who delivers Judah (and us) from our spiritual problems.

Saturday: Isaiah 44:14-21. Consider the security of God's people in these verses.
