

DAILY DEVOTION

Memory Text — Isaiah $40:11 - ^{11}$ He will tend his flock like a shepherd; he will gather the lambs in his arms; he will carry them in his bosom, and gently lead those that are with young.

Westminster Confession 11.3 (on Justification) Christ, by His obedience and death, did fully discharge the debt of all those that are thus justified, and did make a proper, real and full satisfaction to His Father's justice in their behalf. Yet, in as much as He was given by the Father for them; and His obedience and satisfaction accepted in their stead; and both, freely, not for any thing in them; their justification is only of free grace; that both the exact justice, and rich grace of God might be glorified in the justification of sinners.

Monday: Read Isaiah 53:4-6. This chapter is all about what do with guilt. What did Adam do with his guilt (Gen 3:12)? What did the lawyer do with his (Lk 10:29)? How does our culture avoid guilt by finding scape-goats, and cancelling people? How does avoidance of guilt play into when you blame, accuse, excuse, and self-justify? What does God invite us to do with guilt (4-6)?

Tuesday: Isaiah 53:1-7. How does Leviticus 16:15-22 provide the background for the "sprinkling" (v 15), "laid on him the iniquity" (v 6), and the "lamb to be slaughtered" (7)? Reflect on Jesus our atoning sacrifice in Jn 1:29 and Heb 10:12-14. What will you do with your guilt? Take some time and "lay yours sin on Jesus' head" in prayer. Receive his forgiveness, your sins are atoned for!

Wednesday: Isaiah 53. Why did Jesus have to suffer/undergo humiliation (Heb 2:17)? How do you see this suffering in v 14 (Mk 14:65), v 2 (Jn 1:46), v 3 (Jn 1:10/Mk 15:32), v 8 (Mt 27:24ff), 8-9 (Mt 27:38)? How does all of Jesus' suffering make him a compassionate high priest, able to minister to you in your sufferings? How does Jesus' delivering you from the anguish of hell by his sufferings comfort and assure you in your weakest moments?

Thursday: Isaiah 53:3-7. Jesus was a man of sorrows (v 6) -whose sorrows were they (v 4)? How do the "he" versus "we/our" contrasts argue for Jesus as our substitute? According to these verses, what does he take of ours? What evidence is there that Jesus' death was a penalty-paying atonement (Rom 4:25, 1 Pet 2:24, 2 Cor 5:21)? How fully are your sins paid for? How does this give you assurance of God's love? If Jesus has done this for you, how should you treat those who sin against you (Eph 4:32)?

Friday: Isaiah 53:10-12. How do these verses speak of Jesus' resurrection? His exaltation? What do you think "he shall see and be satisfied" means (Heb 12:2, Rev 7:9-10)? What spoil/benefits does Jesus share with the spiritually strong (Eph 4:7-13)? If Christ has sacrificed his all for you (v 10, 12), how will you sacrifice for Him and for those nearest you (Rom 12:1)?

Saturday: Pray for the Spirit to attend his Word and inflame our hearts tomorrow.
