Assurance of Pardon — Hebrews 12:1-2

Therefore, since we are surrounded by so great a cloud of witnesses, let us also lay aside every weight, and sin which clings so closely, and let us run with endurance the race that is set before us, ² looking to Jesus, the founder and perfecter of our faith, who for the joy that was set before him endured the cross, despising the shame, and is seated at the right hand of the throne of God.

Confession of Sin — Hebrews 12:3-14

³ Consider him who endured from sinners such hostility against himself, so that you may not grow weary or fainthearted. ⁴ In your struggle against sin you have not yet resisted to the point of shedding your blood. ⁵ And have you forgotten the exhortation that addresses you as sons?

"My son, do not regard lightly the discipline of the Lord, nor be weary when reproved by him.

⁶ For the Lord disciplines the one he loves, and chastises every son whom he receives."

⁷ It is for discipline that you have to endure. God is treating you as sons. For what son is there whom his father does not discipline? ⁸ If you are left without discipline, in which all have participated, then you are illegitimate children and not sons. ⁹ Besides this, we have had earthly fathers who disciplined us and we respected them. Shall we not much more be subject to the Father of spirits and live? ¹⁰ For they disciplined us for a short time as it seemed best to them, but he disciplines us for our good, that we may share his holiness. ¹¹ For the moment all discipline seems painful rather than pleasant, but later it yields the peaceful fruit of righteousness to those who have been trained by it.

¹² Therefore lift your drooping hands and strengthen your weak knees, ¹³ and make straight paths for your feet, so that what is lame may not be put out of joint but rather be healed. ¹⁴ Strive for peace with everyone, and for the holiness without which no one will see the Lord.

¹⁸ Hear, you deaf,

and look, you blind, that you may see!

¹⁹Who is blind but my servant,

or deaf as my messenger whom I send?

Who is blind as my dedicated one,

or blind as the servant of the LORD?

²⁰ He sees many things, but does not observe them; his ears are open, but he does not hear.

DAILY DEVOTION

Memory Text — Isaiah 40:8 — ⁸ The grass withers, the flower fades, but the word of our God will stand forever.

Westminster Confession 5.7 As the providence of God does, in general, reach to all creatures; so, after a most special manner, it takes care of His Church, and disposes all things to the good thereof.

Monday: Isaiah 42:18-25. Read Luke 15:11-13. How did this younger son squander his father's wealth? Of what is this a picture (15:32, 1-2)? How had Israel squandered their religious privileges (Is 42:18-21)? Has God called you out of a squandered life? How? Confess where to you tend to squander (not capitalize on) religious privileges. Pray for help to change.

Tuesday: Isaiah 42:24-43:3. How did God try change the squanderers (vv 24-25)? Did they change? How does 43:1 offer hope to them? Why does he use creation language (Deut 32:6, Ps 51:10, Jn 3:3)? God covenanted to make a people for himself (the language of v 4). Does that mean all of them would turn? How is this a warning to you (Heb 3:12-14, 4:11)?

Wednesday: Isaiah 43:1-2. How do you think the heat of v 2 is meant to press God's people back to v 1? When have you experienced God forging your faith through trial? In v 2 what comforts does God give when we go through trials (1 Pet 1:6ff, James 1:2ff)? How did Daniel's three friends live out this verse (Dan 3:15-18)? Does this mean trials won't hurt or kill us (1 Pet 5:10-11, 1 Thess 4:17)?

Thursday: Isaiah 43:3-6. How does God bind squanderers to himself (vv 3-4, Mk 10:45, Eph 1:5)? What intimacy is there between God and his remnant people (v 4)? How does God gather his people home (vv 4-5, Jn 14:1-3)? Meditate on God's beauty and work as described in these verses. How do/can/should you reflect these things in your church family? Personal family?

Friday: In Isaiah 43:4, 7. What reasons does God give for ransoming, welcoming, and restoring his squanderous people? How does this provide hope for you? How does this elevate your view of God? How does this compel you to follow hard after him?

Saturday: Isaiah 45:1-8. How does Cyrus function as God's servant? What does this tell you about world leaders? About God?
