DAILY DEVOTION

Memory Text: Isaiah 60:1 — Arise, shine, for your light has come, and the glory of the Lord has risen upon you.

Westminster Larger Catechism 89 What shall be done to the wicked at the day of judgment? At the day of judgment, the wicked shall be set on Christ's left hand, and, upon clear evidence, and full conviction of their own consciences, shall have the fearful but just sentence of condemnation pronounced against them; and thereupon shall be cast out from the favorable presence of God, and the glorious fellowship with Christ, his saints, and all his holy angels, into hell, to be punished with unspeakable torments, both of body and soul, with the devil and his angels forever.

Monday: Isaiah 63:1. Trace the enmity between Edom (Esau) and God's people in Gen 27:41, Is 34:5-6, Obadiah 14-15, Mal 1:2-6, Mt 2:16-17. What does Edom represent (Mal 1:3, Rom 9:13)? What does God do with his and his church's enemies if they do not repent? How is that part of salvation? Consider: is this justice a reason for praise in Rev 19:1-3 (cf 1 Cor 15:25)?

Tuesday: Isaiah 63:1-6. If we only focus on Christ's mercy, we have a faulty view of Christ. "We know nothing of the emotions proper to absolute holiness." How does this passage help correct that? How does this underline the odiousness of sin? Compare Is 63:1-6 with Rev 19:14-15 and Matthew 25:41-46. What is Jesus doing in these verses (Rev 14:19-20, 1 Pet 4:5)? This is the truth -why must we know it?

Wednesday: Isaiah 63:1-6 comes in the context of prayer. Look at 62:6-7, 63:15, 17, 64:1. How can you praise God for his character based on Is 63? Pray for several specific people who do not know the Lord yet. Pray that the American church faithfully preaches both the wrath and the mercy of God.

Thursday: Isaiah 63:7. What does Isaiah immediately call to mind after preaching on the Day of Wrath? How is God's wrath an outworking of God's love for righteousness and hatred of sin? Consider several of God's "steadfast loves": Ex 32:27-32, Num 21:4-8, Jonah 4:2. Ponder the greatest mercy in the world in Lk 22:41-44, Mt 27:45f. Praise Jesus for what he has done for you!

Friday: Isaiah 63:7-64:2. What does Isaiah respond to Judgment Day (v 7)? Why? What was God's response to their prior rebellion (vv 10-14)? What is Isaiah's prayer (v 15, 17)? In 64:1-2? How has God answered 64:1-2 (see Heb 12:22ff, 25-29)? Ponder the awe-filling glory of God. Thank Jesus for saving you from this wrath. Pray that God would break through hard hards to show you his holiness and mercy.

Saturday: How do you think we are to respond to Isaiah 65:16-25?
