

Pastor Bio

Pastor Gerry Malkus was born into a pastor's home. His father was a missionary, pastor and foreign mission executive.

He attended both Covenant College, where he met Pam, his wife of 54 years, and then Covenant Theological Seminary. He was ordained in the Reformed Presbyterian Church, Evangelical Synod at the time of his call to be the church planter in Charleston, South Carolina, where he served for 16 years.

Gerry joined the Orthodox Presbyterian Church as church planting pastor in Marlton, NJ, then was called to the same position in Syracuse, New York. He became the first called pastor of Hope Presbyterian Church and served in Syracuse until "retiring" in 2016.

Since leaving Syracuse, Gerry has served as an interim pastor in six congregations: in Ontario, Cape Cod , Manchester, NH, Kent and Lynnwood, WA and Catlett, VA.

Pam and Gerry now live in Mount Sidney, Virginia and attend the in Staunton Orthodox Presbyterian.
