Sermon Text — John 15:9-17

John 15:1-8

Theme: Abiding in the love of Christ, who abides in the love of His Father, is loving one another.

- 1. Jesus motivates us to abide in His love (15:9-11)
 - Abide in Christ's love because we have been loved by Christ (9a)
 - Abide in Christ's love by imitating Christ's love for the Father (10)
 - Abide in Christ's love so that you may experience Christ's joy (11)
- 2. Jesus commands us to share His love with others (15:12-13)
 - Abiding in Christ's love and joy necessitates loving others
 - Abiding in Christ's love and joy results in loving like Christ's
- 3. Jesus reveals His transforming love for us (15:14-17)
 - Abiding in Christ's love extends from our friendship with Christ (14)
 - Abiding in Christ's love stems from being chosen by Christ (16)
 - Abiding in Christ's love comes from submitting to Christ (17).
