People: We will do what we can for our neighbor's good, and work faithfully so that we may share with the poor.

Leader: You shall not give false testimony against your neighbor.

People: We will speak the truth with our neighbor in love, render judgments that are true and make for peace, and not devise in our hearts any evil against anyone.

Leader: You shall not covet anything that belongs to your neighbor.

People: We will be content whatever the circumstances through the strength of Christ within us.

Leader: Thus we must love our neighbor as ourselves.

DAILY DEVOTION

Memory Text — Ephesisans 2:3 And you were dead in the trespasses and sins ² in which you once walked, following the course of this world, following the prince of the power of the air, the spirit that is now at work in the sons of disobedience— ³ among whom we all once lived in the passions of our flesh, carrying out the desires of the body and the mind, and were by nature children of wrath, like the rest of mankind.

Westminster Confession 3.6 As God has appointed the elect unto glory, so has He, by the eternal and most free purpose of His will, foreordained all the means thereunto. Wherefore, they who are elected, being fallen in Adam, are redeemed by Christ, are effectually called unto faith in Christ by His Spirit working in due season, are justified, adopted, sanctified, and kept by His power, through faith, unto salvation.

Monday: What does Eph 1:4 state is one goal or purpose of election? What does it mean to be holy and blameless (see Eph 5:27, 1 Thess 3:12-13)? Based in part on "before him," and Col 1:22, Eph 1:4 is best seen as future, completed holiness at Jesus' return (e.g. 1 Jn 3:2, Eph 5:27). How does this give you confidence despite your present holiness? How does it move you to praise?

Tuesday: Eph 1:4. Although this "holy and blameless" will ultimately be fulfilled in the future, God chose us "in him" for holiness. How is Christ involved in our holiness now (Col 1:22, 1 Pet 1:18-19)? How does this certain holiness (ours now in Jesus, and its future completion) move us to live more holily now (Eph 4:1-3, 22-24)? Meditate on this.

Wednesday: Eph 1:5. Consider the beautiful doctrine of adoption from Gal 3:26, 4:4-6, Rom 8:12-17, 29, Deut 14:2. That is what God chose/elected us for (Eph 1:5). What does this say about the certainty of God's people being in intimate, personal, eternal, legal family-relationship with him? Does this depend on your feeling it, or being good enough? What does it tell you about God?

Thursday: Eph 1:5. Election is often thought of as a cold, hard doctrine. How does "in love" and "adoption" dispel that? How does Paul use this doctrine later to shape our thinking and living (Eph 5:1ff)? What is your responsibility as beloved children? Remind yourself regularly today you are God's loved, adopted child.

Friday: What is the ultimate purpose of election according to Eph 1:6? What is the difference between "his will, his grace, and his blessing"? Review vv 3-6 and see if you find cause to praise God for his plan (will, purpose), his grace, and his gifts in Christ. Spend some time in prayer thanking and praising God.

Saturday: Read Eph 1:7-10. How do these verses all hold together?
