DAILY DEVOTION

Memory Text — **Ephesisans 2:4-5** ⁴But God, being rich in mercy, because of the great love with which he loved us, ⁵ even when we were dead in our trespasses, made us alive together with Christ...

Westminster Confession 11.3 Christ, by His obedience and death, did fully discharge the debt of all those that are thus justified, and did make a proper, real and full satisfaction to His Father's justice in their behalf. Yet, in as much as He was given by the Father for them; and His obedience and satisfaction accepted in their stead; and both, freely, not for any thing in them; their justification is only of free grace; that both the exact justice, and rich grace of God might be glorified in the justification of sinners.

Monday: Read Eph 1:3, 7-8 and pray to be moved to thanksgiving and wonder. "Without forgiveness you cannot live in loving community." Imagine your social groups and relationships *without* any forgiveness (contrasted to Eph 4:1-8). What would the church, and our relationship with God be like if He did not offer redemption and forgiveness? Give thanks throughout today for the gift of forgiveness.

Tuesday: Eph 1:7. Define redemption by looking at Deut 7:8, Mt 18:32-35, Heb 9:15. "Have" is present tense -an ongoing possession. Redemption is "the" redemption. How do those two nuances underline the experience of and new condition of redemption? Think about yourself as being a slave -of sin, the devil, fleshly desires. Jesus has redeemed you from that! Keep thinking today, "I'm a redeemed one!"

Wednesday: According to Eph 1:7 what was the cost of your redemption (see Lev 16:15-16, Is 53:4-7, 1 Pet 1:19)? What does this tell you about the horrible depths of our sin? What does it tell you about the power, purity, and love of Jesus (Heb 7:26, 9:12-14)? How will you respond to this (e.g. 2 Cor 5:20, Rev 5:9, Lk 19:8-9)?

Thursday: Eph 1:7. A trespass is a crossing over what God has forbidden. Name some of your trespasses. What is the payoff of redemption? Here too it is "the forgiveness" -emphasizing the completeness, and once-for-all aspect of forgiveness (Col 2:14). How does this argue against your self-flagellation, blame-shifting, hiding, atoning, and diminishing of sin? How does it argue for a response of a thankful life?

Friday: Eph 1:7-8. What is the power of forgiveness according to vv 7-8? Why is it so glorious that redemption is by grace? What does it mean that God gives "according to" the riches of his grace? How does this lavish grace of forgiveness that is yours influence how you deal with others (see Eph 4:30, 31, 32)?

Saturday: Read Eph 1:9-10. How does God's future master plan make any difference to you in today's chaos?
