

They can be put in the offering on any Sunday through 12/31/2023 or mailed to the church with a postmark of no later than 12/31/2023 and received by 1/7/2024. Mailed checks received after 1/7/2024 will be recorded for tax year 2024, regardless of check date, unless there is a clear postmark of 12/31/2023 or earlier.

Change to Worship Time, On January 14, 2024, Session plans to start a three month trial of beginning our worship services at 10:45am instead of 10:30am. This idea came to us from the Welcome Team, and was studied and then recommended to us by the Worship Committee. Before we implement this, however, we'd like to weigh any concerns or questions you have. So if you have any, please email or talk to any elder. There are two pain points that this resolves: a rushed transition time between Sunday School and worship, and lack of fellowship time prior to the service. This shift will more than double the time for fellowship (10:20 to 10:45), and give ample time to pick up children from their classes and go to the bathroom. Here are answers to some of the questions that have already been asked:

- Will Sunday School go longer? Sunday school will still start at 9:30am and end at 10:20am. Although this will not extend the Sunday School teaching time, it does give parents time to get their kids, teachers a chance to clean up or answer questions after class.
- Why a three month trial? Although we don't anticipate changing it
 after three months, this allows a significant trial to see if it is actually making a difference, and to see if there are any unanticipated
 effects.
- Why not start Sunday School at 9am? We did not want to lengthen anyone's day if at all possible. Starting Sunday school earlier would affect musicians, sound techs, and parents of young children. For some it would likely mean skipping Sunday School.
- Won't the services end well past noon? Although ending at noon
 has never been a priority, our little ones in nursery and children's
 church and the folks that serve in them are a priority and we want
 to be mindful of the length of time that the service goes. For several reasons the services have recently been about 10 minutes short-

er than a year ago and so the 15 minute later start time should not be much of a pain point.

Although the services will start later, we encourage you to still arrive by 10:30am for worship so that you can enjoy fellowship time, and we can all start worship on time together. If you have questions or comments, please let us know!

DAILY DEVOTION

Memory Verse: Luke 1:78-29 — 78 because of the tender mercy of our God, whereby the sunrise shall visit us from on high 79 to give light to those who sit in darkness and in the shadow of death, to guide our feet into the way of peace."

Westminster Shorter Catechism 21: Who is the Redeemer of God's elect? The only Redeemer of God's elect is the Lord Jesus Christ, who, being the eternal Son of God, became man, and so was, and continues to be, God and man in two distinct natures, and one person, for ever.

Monday: Luke 1:79 talks about guiding our feet into the way of peace. What is the opposite of the "way of peace" (consider Gen 3:8-13, 16-19; Ex 2:23-25; Rom 3:10-17)? Contact this lack of peace with Psalm 23 and the shepherd's leading his flock into the way of peace (wholeness, happiness, well-being, joy). Muse on how Jesus does this with you.

Tuesday: How does Luke 1:78-70 relate to Isaiah 9:1-11? Imagine yourself sitting in physical darkness and finally the sun rising. How would you respond? How do people in Isaiah 9:3 respond? Why? How is Christ's coming (and return) like a sunrise? How does his light guide our feet "into the way of peace"?

Wednesday: Luke 1:79. Jesus guides us into the way of peace. But his life was not one of peace. How do you see this already in Luke 2:12, Mt 2:13f, Col 1:19-20. What did Jesus have to accomplish to be able to say "Peace to you" (Luke 24:36, 45f)? Praise him for the cost of his peace-making!

Thursday: Read Luke 2:8-14 and Rev 5:9-14. How does Christ's work bring peace between God and sinners (Rom 5:1)? How does this spread between Christians and others? What part of both these relationships is reserved for full reality in heaven? Where in the church or at home are you "pasting over" issues that need true peace brought to bear (Rom 14:19, 2 Cor 13:11)? How will you do this?

Friday: Read Luke 2:8-14. How do the angels connect Jesus' birth with peace? What is their response? This peace results in the presence of God how is that pictured in v 11-12? This peace also results in God's pleasure on the believer—how do you see that in v 14? Exercise your faith by actively believing throughout today that God is present with you. Pleased with you. At peace with you.

Saturday: Read Leviticus 23:23-44. What stamped Israel's time?
