DAILY DEVOTION

Memory Text — Ephesians 2:4-5 ⁴But God, being rich in mercy, because of the great love with which he loved us, ⁵even when we were dead in our trespasses, made us alive together with Christ—by grace you have been saved—

Heidelberg Catechism 116: Why is prayer necessary for Christians? Because it is the chief part of thankfulness which God requires of us: and also, because God will give his grace and Holy Spirit to those only, who with sincere desires continually ask them of him, and are thankful for them.

Monday: Eph 1:15. “For this reason” connects back to vv 3-14, but especially vv 13-14. Summarize those verses. How do the truths in those verses ignite faith and love in God’s people (see Gal 5:6, 1 Tim 1:14, 1 Jn 4:19)? Pray that God would provoke you to specific loving acts and expressions of faith because of his spiritual blessings.

Tuesday: Eph 1:15. Distinguish between the three elements of faith (knowing, affirming, trusting). Can you think of some biblical examples of people demonstrating faith (e.g. Heb 11)? Give an example from your life of how you are trusting Jesus as Lord and Savior. Give thanks to God for this work in your life.

Wednesday: Eph 1:15. What is the root of the Ephesian’s love (1:4-5, 1 Jn 4:19)? What is our example (Eph 5:25-29)? How can this love “for all” the saints be convicting (Eph 2:11, 14, James 2:1-3)? How can you look out for someone else today, and express love to them? Is there a specific act of love you’ve observed for which you can thank God?

Thursday: Eph 1:15-16. Based on these verses, how can you grow in thanking God in prayer? What effect do you think this will have on you? Cultivate eyes to see faith and love-acts in others. When you see faith or love demonstrated, note it. Remember to thank God for it. Consider starting a thanksgiving log for acts of faith and love.

Friday: Eph 1:15-16. Paul had to hear about the Ephesians’ acts of faith and love in order to thank God for them. How can you observe such things? What is a way you can ask someone about their exercising of faith? Listen for acts of love and faith today. Can you share with someone else how your faith has been exercised, or love shared? Do this for God’s glory.

Saturday: Ephesians 1:17-23. In these verses Paul prays that the spiritual blessings of vv 3-14 will be experienced more by the saints. For what three main things does he pray?
