

DAILY DEVOTION

Memory Text — Ephesians 2:4 ⁴**But God, being rich in mercy, because of the great love with which he loved us,** ⁵even when we were dead in our trespasses, made us alive together with Christ—

Westminster Confession 6.4, 6.2: Of the Fall of Man, of Sin — By this sin they fell from their original righteousness and communion, with God, and so became dead in sin, and wholly defiled in all the parts and faculties of soul and body. From this original corruption, whereby we are utterly indisposed, disabled, and made opposite to all good, and wholly inclined to all evil, do proceed all actual transgressions.

Monday: Eph 2:1. Who is dead according to Eph 2:1? What does it mean by "dead" (Col 1:21, 2:13, Eph 4:18, Rom 5:12-14)? Why is this death the most horrible problem, despite many spiritually dead people thriving physically? How does Paul later apply this "you once were dead, but are now alive" in Eph 4:22-24, 5:7-14?

Tuesday: Eph 2:2. What two enemies does Eph 2:2 name that enslave us to alienation from God (spiritual death)? How does the world entrap unbelievers? How does the devil entrap unbelievers (Zech 3:1, Mt 4:9f, Mk 4:15, 2 Cor 11:14, Rev 12:9)? Where do you see and feel the pull of the world and the devil? How does 1:20-21 and 6:10ff show us the powerlessness of these forces once we believe in Christ? How can you practice "be strong in the Lord"?

Wednesday: Eph 2:3. Our third enemy, the flesh, keeps unbelievers spiritually dead. According to "passions" and "desires," how willingly did we sin? What is the difference between an unbeliever's sin (Eph 2:1-3), and a believer's sin (e.g. Rom 7:15-24)? How deep is the sin (v3)? What is the end result of being dead in sin? Do you see sin as this drastic of a problem? How do you view unbelievers? What about your remaining sin -are you blasé toward it? Spend some time in honest confession with God.

Thursday: Eph 2:4. In light of vv 1-3, consider the magnitude of v 4's "but God." Before we're told what God did about our dead condition, what do we learn about God? What other attributes of God can you glean from v 7 and 8? What does salvation completely depend on? Praise God for his character as revealed here. Try call them to mind throughout the day, and share them with someone else.

Friday: Eph 2:5. What had God powerfully done in 1:19-20? What does he do to the believer in 2:5-6? How do we become alive in Jesus (Col 2:12-14)? Reflect on the grace of God to you in your salvation. Worship God for taking that which is dead and giving you life. Praise and thank God for the miracle and high privilege of being a Christian. How does this glorious, gracious salvation make you want to live?

Saturday: Eph 2:4-7. What parallels do you see between 1:20 and 2:5-6? Marvel at being united to Christ, and thus gaining all his benefits.
