

DAILY DEVOTION

Memory Text — Ephesians 2:6-7 ...by grace you have been saved— ⁶ and raised us up with him and seated us with him in the heavenly places in Christ Jesus, ⁷ so that in the coming ages he might show the immeasurable riches of his grace in kindness toward us in Christ Jesus.

Westminster Confession 14.1. The grace of faith, whereby the elect are enabled to believe to the saving of their souls, is the work of the Spirit of Christ in their hearts, and is ordinarily wrought by the ministry of the Word, by which also, and by the administration of the sacraments, and prayer, it is increased and strengthened.

Monday: Ephesians 1:17-18. What is the main thing Paul prays for in v 17? Don't the Ephesians already know God (v 13)? What is Paul after? How does it relate to vv 3-14? Do you look for extra things/ways to get more of God, or do you go deeper into the blessings God has already given you? Pray for the Spirit's illumination (2 Cor 4:6, 2 Pet 3:18, Eph 3:16-17) for yourself, and for others.

Tuesday: Ephesians 1:17-18. We want and need to grow in appropriating, resting in, and obeying God and the Word. Pray for this. How are you being faithful in your part to grow (prayer, the Word, reflecting and meditating on the Word/God, growth over time through trials and experience, growing with/ in community)? Perhaps take one truth from vv 3-14 and reflect on that today.

Wednesday: Ephesians 1:18. The Ephesians were once without hope (2:12). What does it look like to live without hope? Paul prays that we appropriate the hope of God's calling. What is this calling (see vv 3-14)? How is that calling to affect us now (4:1)? Consider the significance of your being called into fellowship with God, to live for him, to be his adopted child (see 2:10, 13, 5:1-2).

Thursday: Ephesian 1:18. What is biblical hope (Heb 11:1)? The "hope of God's calling" pushes us to the future realization of God's plan. See this in 1:9-10 and 14. How does this certain end secure us to live faithfully in the present (Rom 5:2, Col 3:4)? How does it give us stability despite the news, health, or impending death?

Friday: Ephesians 1:18. What does it mean that we are God's inheritance (Deut 4:20, 7:6, Eph 1:7, 11, 1 Pet 2:9)? What is God's view of you in Christ (Eph 5:25, 29)? Does this depend on your getting life together (Eph 2:5)? How can you make the truth that you are God's treasured possession a more settled conviction in your own life? How can you strengthen someone else with this truth?

Saturday: Ephesians 1:19-23. What is the third specific thing for which Paul prays (v 19)? How does he underline it in vv 20-23?
