Nobody can emerge from a careful reading of Paul's letter to the Ephesians with a privatized gospel. For Ephesians is the gospel of the church. It sets forth God's eternal purpose to create through Jesus Christ a new society which stands out in bright relief against the somber background of the old world. For God's new society is characterized by life in place of death, by unity and reconciliation in place of division and alienation, by the wholesome standards of righteousness in place of the corruption of wickedness, by love and peace in place of hatred and strife, and by unremitting conflict with evil in place of flabby compromise with it...For the sake of the glory of God and the evangelization of the world, nothing is more important than that the church should be, and should be seen to be, God's new society. ~ John Stott

¹¹ Beloved, I urge you as sojourners and exiles to abstain from the passions of the flesh, which wage war against your soul. ¹² Keep your conduct among the Gentiles honorable, so that when they speak against you as evildoers, they may see your good deeds and glorify God on the day of visitation.

DAILY DEVOTION

Memory Text — Ephesians 2:7 — ⁴ But God, being rich in mercy, because of the great love with which he loved us, ⁵ even when we were dead in our trespasses, made us alive together with Christ—by grace you have been saved— ⁶ and raised us up with him and seated us with him in the heavenly places in Christ Jesus, ⁷ so that in the coming ages he might show the immeasurable riches of his grace in kindness toward us in Christ Jesus.

Westminster Confession 26.1 All saints, that are united to Jesus Christ their Head, by His Spirit, and by faith, have fellowship with Him in His grace, sufferings, death, resurrection, and glory: and, being united to one another in love, they have communion in each other's gifts and graces, and are obliged to the performance of such duties, public and private, as do conduce to their mutual good, both in the inward and outward man.

Monday: Eph 2:22. What is the significance of "together" given the context (vv 11-12)? How does Jesus ("in him") bring them together? How does God dwell in us (1 Cor 6:19)? What does the Spirit make us realize and live for (Eph 1:3-14, Col 1:27, Phil 3:7-11)?

Tuesday: Eph 2:19. "Citizens" has the idea of kingdom-members. Contrast this with v 12. How does the Spirit make us King Jesus' kingdommembers (Col 1:13)? What attitudes, actions, directions does being a kingdom citizen entail? How can you reflect this in your commitment, attitude toward, and investment in New Hope (i.e. the people)?

Wednesday: Eph 2:19. What are the ingredients of a healthy household (family)? How has the Spirit made us part of God's household though Jesus (Eph 1:5)? What do you think it means for New Hope to function as Jesus' family (1 Pet 1:22, Gal 6:2, Eph 4:15-16)? Praise God for specifics of where you have seen this. Where does this challenge you?

Thursday: Consider "cornerstone" in Eph 2:20 by reading Ps 118:22, Isaiah 28:16, and 1 Pet 2:4-11. How is Jesus like a cornerstone? Why must the church build on Jesus? Pray for New Hope, and other churches, to preach and live by the Word. How can you grow more "on" God's Word?

Friday: Eph 2:21. What does each phrase in this verse mean? Why are the verb tenses what they are? Why is "holy" added? Think about this text from the perspective of church members "together." What does this call you to? How can you pray this text for New Hope? What will the church ultimately look like (Rev 21:22-22:5)?

Saturday: Read Eph 3:1-13. What is "the stewardship of God's grace"? How do you share in it?
