Rebuild relationally:

- purpose to grow closer to God this month. Plan it and practice it. If you are not currently reading your Bible daily, commit to reading 1 chapter of Matthew each day. Or Mt 5 -7 over and over. Use the daily devotions in the bulletin to help. Plan a time to pray each day. Watch something that will grow you spiritually instead of your usual.
- practice hospitality (at least) once this month. Get together with another congregants and seek to grow spiritually together.
- Maybe meet for prayer before church. Or a coffee and ask them what about life they find the hardest.
- Refresh Physically: fight to slow down this month and do something refreshing. go for a walk. read a book. shoot some hoops.

DAILY DEVOTIONS

Memory Verse — Ephesians 2:10 ¹⁰ For we are his workmanship, created in Christ Jesus for good works, which God prepared beforehand, that we should walk in them.

Heidelberg Catechism 54: What do you believe concerning the "holy catholic church" of Christ? That the Son of God from the beginning to the end of the world, gathers, defends, and preserves to himself by his Spirit and word, out of the whole human race, a church chosen to everlasting life, agreeing in true faith; and that I am and forever shall remain, a living member thereof.

Monday: Eph 4:1. How do people evaluate worth today? Do you lead a worthy life? What has God called you from (Eph 2:1-3, 12)? To what (glorious) life has he called you (2:8-10)? How are we to respond to such a calling (Rom 12:1, Phil 1:27, Col 1:10)? Are you leading a worthy life, based on your new identity? Where have you become slothful, disobedient? How can you walk more worthily of your calling (be specific)?

Tuesday: Eph 4:2. Give examples of how Jesus lived these perfectly (cf Mt 11:29, Phil 2:3-8)? Jesus was radically other-centered, selfless. Where do you exhibit these characteristics? In which of these (v 2) is the Spirit pricking you? Do you tend toward boasting? Inconsiderateness? Impatience? Intolerance? Pray specifically for God to work one of these in yourself. Pray the same for someone else.

Wednesday: According to Eph 4:3, what does Paul first focus on in charging us to live a worthy life? What unity has the Spirit already worked (2:14, 16, 21)? How do the ingredients of v 2 explain how we are to strive to "maintain" it? How specifically does the Spirit want you to maintain unity today? How is v 3 motivating as to being part of what the Spirit is doing?

Thursday: Eph 4:4-6. Paul presses for unity -but is this unity to be at all costs, or must there be some doctrinal agreement (vv 4-6)? What unity do we all share (4-6)? Note the three persons of the Trinity here. Paul founds our unity on the unity of the godhead. How do they love and prefer one another (Jn 17:24-26)?

Friday: Eph 4:4-6. Consider with what confidence we can walk worthily, eagerly maintaining unity, and picking up our cross: who is building the body (4:5, 2:20-22, 3:16)? To whom are we united, and whose record is given to us (5, 1:4-7)? Whose power are we to draw on (v 6, 3:20)? "Oh, magnify the LORD with me, and let us exalt his name together" (Ps 34:3) - let's live worthy of our calling, to His glory!

Saturday: Eph 4:7-16. Why must 4:2 be particularly present in light of vv 7-16?
