Reflections

When the object of hope is not any human agent but God, then hope means confidence, certainty, and full assurance (Heb. 11:1). To have hope in God is not to have an uncertain, anxious wish that he will affirm your plan but to recognize that he and he alone is trustworthy, that everything else will let you down (Ps. 42:5, 11; 62:10), and that his plan is infinitely wise and good. If I believe in the resurrection of Jesus, that confirms that there is a God who is both good and powerful, who brings light out of darkness, and who is patiently working out a plan for his glory, our good, and the good of the world (Eph. 1:9–12; Rom. 8:28). Christian hope means that I stop betting my life and happiness on human agency and rest in him.



²⁴ And they crucified him and divided his garments among them, casting lots for them, to decide what each should take. ²⁵ And it was the third hour when they crucified him. ²⁶ And the inscription of the charge against him read, "The King of the Jews." ²⁷ And with him they crucified two robbers, one on his right and one on his left. ²⁹ And those who passed by derided him, wagging their heads and saying, "Aha! You who would destroy the temple and rebuild it in three days, ³⁰ save yourself, and come down from the cross!" ³¹ So also the chief priests with the scribes mocked him to one another, saying, "He saved others; he cannot save himself. ³² Let the Christ, the King of Israel, come down now from the cross that we may see and believe." Those who were crucified with him also reviled him.

Congregational Prayer

Sermon Text — Mark 16:1-8

When the Sabbath was past, Mary Magdalene, Mary the mother of James, and Salome bought spices, so that they might go and anoint him. ² And very early on the first day of the week, when the sun had risen, they went to the tomb. ³ And they were saying to one another, "Who will roll away the stone for us from the entrance of the tomb?" ⁴ And looking up, they saw that the stone had been rolled back—it was very large. ⁵ And entering the tomb, they saw a young man sitting on the right side, dressed in a white robe, and they were alarmed. ⁶ And he said to them, "Do not be alarmed. You seek Jesus of Nazareth, who was crucified. He has risen; he is not here. See the place where they laid him. ⁷ But go, tell his disciples and Peter that he is going before you to Galilee. There you will see him, just as he told you." ⁸ And they went out and fled from the tomb, for trembling and astonishment had seized them, and they said nothing to anyone, for they were afraid.



DAILY DEVOTIONS

Memory Verse — Ephesians 2:10 ¹⁰ For we are his workmanship, created in Christ Jesus for good works, which God prepared beforehand, that we should walk in them.

Heidelberg Catechism 45: What does the "resurrection" of Christ profit us? First, by his resurrection he has overcome death, that he might make us partakers of that righteousness which he had purchased for us by his death (1 Cor 15:16, Rom 4:25, 1 Pet 1:3); secondly, we are also by his power raised up to a new life (Rom 6:4, Col 3:1, 3, Eph 2:5f); and lastly, the resurrection of Christ is a sure pledge of our blessed resurrection (1 Cor 15:12, 20, 21, Rom 8:11).

Monday: Mark 16:1-3. What did the women plan to do? Why was it dangerous for the women to show support for Jesus (Mark 15:10, 15)? How does the danger, the hour, and how long Jesus was dead underline their love and devotion to him? How do you express your devotion to God in actions (Tit 2:14)?

Tuesday: Mark 16:1-5. Mark's main question is "who is Jesus." What did Mary Magdalene know personally of Jesus (Mark 16:9, Lk 8:2)? What would they have heard about Jesus identity (Mk 1:40f, 4:39, 5:41f, 6:41, 48)? How is 16:6 the greatest confrontation of who Jesus is (Rom 1:4)? Who do you think Jesus is? What difference has that made in your life?

Wednesday: Mark 16:5-6. Did the women expect Jesus to rise (15:40, Lk 24:21)? What is the significance of the resurrection? Look up three of the major significances of the resurrection using the catechism and its proof texts (above). Make sure you praise God for each of these truths before you end.

Thursday: Mark 16:7. What does the Risen King want the disciples to know (Mark 14:50 and Acts 1:8)? Why is Peter singled out (Mk 14:72, Jn 21:15ff)? What does this tell you about Jesus' resurrection, and your failure and sin? Jesus goes ahead of them and expects his disciples to follow him. How does that pick up Mk 1:17, 2:14 and renew it? Are you following in Jesus footsteps? How can you grow in it?

Friday: Mark 16:8. What response to the fact that Jesus is risen from the dead do the women have? Why trembling, astonishment and fear? Do you have this response to the risen Jesus? Why/why not? It seems that the women's clear disobedience in v 7-8 (at least at first) is a warning to obey the Risen King. What does Jesus call you to do? Are you? Why? With how much zeal?

Saturday: Read Ephesians 4:1-7. What do all Christians have in common?
