Reflections

According to the New Testament, evangelism is just preaching the gospel, the evangel. It is a work of communication in which Christians make themselves mouthpieces for God's message of mercy to sinners. 

Ministry Highlights

Over the next several weeks, we are going to highlight one or two ministries in the bulletin to help folks know about the various ministries in the church, who oversees them, and how they function. Please take some time to read these highlights so that you will have more knowledge and know if maybe you might want to serve in any of them!

Communications

Announcements: Although "announcements" isn't technically at ministry, it is a part of a ministry, the Worship Committee, and our Sunday morning

worship. How the announcements are done on Sundays has always been a perplexing problem. Communication with the church body is a very important thing, and yet, we come into the sanctuary to worship God, hear from His word, and spend time with Him. Verbal announcements can interrupt worship or be a distraction and take away from what we are intended to be doing during the worship service.

As is often the case, getting information to folks when they are all in the same place is helpful and important. Last minute pieces of information sometimes comes our way and needs to be communicated. As the worship committee debated the best way to handle announcements, they have decided to try displaying important announcements on the pull-down screen in the front of the sanctuary from 10:20-10:40 am (during the fellowship time). The hope is that people will see these announcements BEFORE the worship service and then can begin preparing for worship beginning at 10:40 am. This is a trial period and will be evaluated after the first of the year and whether or not it was helpful.

What will be allowed to be a part of the announcements? Anything that directly benefits or promotes ministries or activities for the congregation of New Hope. Anything other than that will not be shown on the screen.

What is the process by which announcements are vetted and promoted? Send your announcement to Gingy in the office no later than end of day on Thursday. Anything later than that will not be considered for the upcoming Sunday. If there is anything questionable about the announcement, the worship committee will be asked to weigh in on if it can be broadcast.

Facebook: New Hope has a private Facebook page that was created to to promote and enhance communication within the congregation of New Hope and its friends. Our desire is to provide a place to share church related information, to give encouragement to the congregation, to give things away, to solicit help for church related functions or for church members, and to share news that affects the congregation. There is a list of guidelines on the page. Anyone that is a part of the New Hope congregation is encouraged to join if you have Facebook. It is a private group and membership to the group is by request. You can find it by searching "New Hope OPC."

DAILY DEVOTIONS

Memory Text — **Ephesians 6:13-15** ¹³ Therefore take up the whole armor of God, that you may be able to withstand in the evil day, and having done all, to stand firm. ¹⁴ Stand therefore, having fastened on the belt of truth, and having put on the breastplate of righteousness, ¹⁵ and, as shoes for your feet, having put on the readiness given by the gospel of peace.

Westminster Shorter Catechism 36 What are the benefits which in this life do accompany or flow from justification, adoption, and sanctification? The benefits which in this life do accompany or flow from justification, adoption, and sanctification, are, assurance of God's love, peace of conscience, joy in the Holy Spirit, increase of grace, and perseverance therein to the end.

Monday: Eph 6:15. Consider peace in the context of Eph 6:11-12. How does Satan fight against peace with God (e.g. Eph 2:1-3, 2 Cor 4:4)? Peace in the church (e.g. 2:14, 1 Cor 11:18)? The peace of believers (e.g. Mt 6:25)? Pray specific prayers for the Prince of Peace to destroy Satan's work.

Tuesday: Eph 6:15. With what did the prophets equate peace in Is 52:7, Nahum 1:15? How is Jesus the Prince of Peace who produces peace (Eph 2:13-18)? Do you wear the peace of Christ (Rom 5:1-2)? What does it look like for you to appropriate the gospel of peace in daily life?

Wednesday: Eph 6:15. The Roman soldier's sandal-boot had studs on the bottom. Why is that important? How might the gospel of peace produce a spiritual stability (e.g. Rom 8:1)? A strength to stand on conviction and truth no matter the cost (Heb 13:5-6, Acts 5:29)? Are you standing strong? Do you know and hold to biblical convictions? How can you grow in spiritual stability?

Thursday: Eph 6:15. The Roman soldier's boots also provided mobility. Satan is anti-peace, and loves to bring division, judgment, fighting. How does the gospel of peace free the believer from a "need" to fight, judge, etc (James 4:1-6, Phil 2:1-8)? Where and how can you bring peace to a specific conflict, relationship, or situation? Pray for wisdom, words, and courage.

Friday: Eph 6:15. The Roman soldier's boots provide mobility to invade the enemy's stronghold. Consider how Rom 10:14-17 and Is 52:1-10 show Eph 6:15 includes a call to bring the gospel of peace to unbelievers. Do you have a specific unbeliever on your mind? Pray for more love, opportunity, courage, as well as others to help water. Imagine what the Lord can do in crushing Satan's power as you pray and witness!

Saturday: Read Ephesians 6:16 in preparation for next week's sermon.
